Two executive sessions were held: one for the CEO's performance appraisal and another addressing financial transparency concerns raised on Reddit. During this meeting Secretary-Treasurer David Levine resigned from the board, due to the limited role of the Secretary-Treasurer in financial matters. Mitch London will take over the treasurer position to finish the term.

I am selling my house and moving to Mexico as soon as possible. This will affect my ability to serve as the Northwest trustee. Jenny Agee is expected to run for the Northwest trustee position once my resignation is effective. I sent an email last night to all of the other trustees and two of them have responded positively. Legislation – Mike Parker

We are proposing a change to the AANR-NW Bylaws for vote at the 2025 General Assembly Meeting. The Bylaws currently state: "**ARTICLE XVI Amendments:** Proposed bylaw amendments shall be submitted to the member clubs 45 days prior to the general assembly meeting. Amendments to these bylaws shall become effective upon approval by 3/4 of the delegates voting at the general assembly meeting." The Proposed change would add "*Major changes to the regional Articles of Incorporation shall be made in the same manner. Address update to the Articles of Incorporation may be made by 2/3 vote of the regional board of directors.*"

We will always host any event, no one else is able to. I believe it is part of our leadership role as the largest club in the Northwest.

(**Jenny Agee** speaking) Alan also stated to me that we would open our club to be used by non-landed clubs. If a non-landed club needs a place to host, you can use the Willamettans grounds and our volunteer corps so that non-landed clubs can even host conventions. **Margie Cantlon** agreed that this has been a long-standing policy at The Willamettans.

Bunny Schwab stated that Serenity Mountain retreat also has the policy of allowing a travel club to use their facilities to host an event.

Motion 4: I move to immediately change the mailbox for AANR-NW to POBox 1135 Sultan, WA and use the physical address of 33033 Cottontail Rd Sultan, WA 98294

Purpose: To save time and funds from our limited budget. The treasurer is the only one receiving any pertinent mail such as invoices and bills. Occasionally we receive an inquiry about a regional club and that information is passed onto that club.

Background: In Spring of 2022, the mail was going to the current treasurer in Worley Idaho, the board voted to have the mail sent to a 'virtual' mailbox using iPostal in Seattle WA. The cost at the time was \$99 annually. Two things happened; costs went up to \$150 annually and the iPostal location closed and was moved to another iPostal location outside of Seattle (Burien). When items arrive at the iPostal location, the treasurer must have the items scanned, forwarded to her personal mailbox or picked up by the treasurer, which are additional costs. We have received only 13 pieces of mail since we opened it 3 years ago. One piece was lost in the mail for about 4 months before the treasurer received it — luckily the treasurer had them scan it before forwarding it to her

Motion 5: I move to immediately allocate \$2,000 (Two Thousand Dollars) from the AANR NW Legal Fund to the AANR Government Affairs Fund for the purpose of supporting professional lobbying in the state of Florida, with the following provisos:

The funding would be provided immediately and solely to support lobbying to defeat anti-nudity bills.

Any alternative expenditure of these funds shall be approved in advance by the Directors of AANR-NW.

Any remaining funds that are not expended by AANR-Government Affairs for this or subsequently authorized purposes by December 31, 2025, shall be returned to the AANR-NW Legal Fund.

Purpose: These funds are intended to backstop funding available from the Florida region to contract with a professional lobbyist for the 2025 legislative session. This need has arisen as a result of loss of a long-time lobbying consultant and the general increase in lobbying costs that could not be met by the region.

AANR has notified the other regions that funds are urgently needed to defeat bills SB1180, its companion HB757 and others expected to be introduced, with are expected to contain language that when strictly interpreted, would criminalize as a Class 3 felony, nude imagery of children if the genitals were exposed and prohibit children from nudist resorts where alcohol is served, which would be a Class 2 misdemeanor.

SB1180, HB757•.

"Child pornography" means:

1. Any image depicting a minor engaged in sexual conduct:

2. Any image that has been created, altered, adapted, modified by electronic, mechanical, or other Means, to portray an identifiable minor engaged in Sexual Conduct: or

3. Any image depicting a minor with actual or simulated exhibition of the genitals.

In addition the following language is expected to be introduced to multiple bills which would prohibit minors from our clubs where alcohol is served. Violation would be a Misdemeanor 2nd degree.

"F.S. 562.48 Minors patronizing, visiting, loitering in a dance hall, or at a clothing-optional or nude establishment or gathering. —Any person operating any dance hall in connection with the operation of any place of business where any alcoholic beverage is sold who shall knowingly permit or allow any person under the age of 18 years to patronize, visit, or loiter in any such dance hall, place of business, clothing-optional or nude establishment or gathering, unless such minor is attended by one or both of his or her parents or by his or her natural guardian, except at a clothing-optional or nude establishment or gathering, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. History.—s. 1, ch. 20838, 1941; s. 1, ch. 28291, 1953; s. 575, ch. 71-136; s. 2, ch. 72-230.

This or similar language is expected to be scattered throughout multiple bills in the works, and loss of professional lobbying would severely hamper the region's effectiveness in combating them. Defeat of these bills is important for all nudists, both to protect against adoption of this legislation in Florida and of similar bills that might subsequently be introduced in other states. AANR-Government Affairs for the Florida Region has engaged a professional lobbyist to oppose adoption of the legislation and is in immediate need of additional funds.

Saturday 4-12-25 Notes

Andee Rodgers opened the meeting by introducing Kane Stanton, who is the AANR-NW Direct Members Director and our Youth Committee Chair.

Kane spoke about the Young Adult and Diversity Advisory Council (YADAC) and the work it is doing with young people. Please read Kane's report . Bruce asked Kane when we might expect to see YADAC presence in the NW clubs. Kane responded that he could be contacted for one-on-one work with our clubs. Karen asked if they were working on a way to make the clubs searchable for diversity policies? Kane stated that their goal is to work with AANR so that all AANR clubs accept diversity.

Dennis spoke about AANR-NW support for the 2025 Folklife Festival. James Pagen from the Willamettans has been working on a short video about AANR that would be suitable for playing in your offices, where your guests check in.

Rhonda suggested that using social media would be the best way to increase the presence of AANR , especially for younger people. Mike suggested that we send Jenny copies of our club news letters for her to have more options for information to post on social media.

In the Zoom comments, Margie wrote that having the AANR logo on your website is a requirement from your clubs contract with AANR.

There was discussion about the eligibility requirements to fill the AANR-NW vice-president and trustee positions. Note that club directors are AANR-NW board members, whether elected or appointed.

The Nude in the Northwest Alvord Desert campout is coming up soon. We will have the AANR-NW 10x20 canopies, and swag. We will have a portable starlink onsite so we can sign people up for AANR on location.

Bruce spoke about the AANR-NW scholarship submission requirements, and whether the questions asked are relevant. Margie noted that the AANR Education Foundation has not received any scholarship applications yet this year.

Karen and Jim Lahey spoke about AANR-NW's webhosting services that has been provided for many years. Companies offered packages in the past that allowed us to do this. This is no longer the case, and the prices have increased to the point that we do not know if we can continue to host club websites. Currently hosted are approximately 9 clubs, plus AANR-NW, and the AANR Education Foundation. Our Current contract goes through March 12, 2026. We need ideas from the clubs on a solution. One solution mentioned is having the affected clubs pay a portion of the cost.

Bruce spoke about AANR being behind in its technology and abilities. Not all people are capable of building websites or have the knowledge required, but there are getting to be more tools to get us around the technology problem. Bruce feels that we can help our clubs build and maintain their own websites.

Break

Andee spoke about liability insurance costs going up. We want all clubs to be aware and prepared for this. Kyle asked if AANR could look at the possibility of finding something like a group rate. Dennis said that Tiger Mountain uses a broker to find them the lowest rate they can.

Jim spoke about the electronic Nudescene that came out in April. Not everybody received it, but a good portion of our group did get it. Future additions will be May, July, September, December and March. It is now in color.

We are still trying to find a venue to hold our Winter Warmup.

Rules of Business for Hybrid On-Site and On-Line Meetings for the AANR-NW Region

“Where there is radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views, gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal.”

Henry Robert, *Parliamentary Law*

The business meeting will be recorded. This meeting is being run as a hybrid meeting, with some members at a meeting site and others by video conference. These rules are slightly modified to accommodate this format.

MOTION PROCEDURES:

Motions are to be written and e-mailed or presented on-site to the president and to the secretary, and the secretary will transcribe the e-mailed motions to an AANR-NW Motion Form. One person needs to make the motion and one needs to second unless put forth by a committee. Whenever possible, the motion will be shown to the on-line board members via camera, scan or program.

When a motion is up for discussion:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can “move the previous question” which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable and requires a 2/3rds vote to adopt.

Dave, an icon in the nudist community, passed away on February 13, 2025, after a courageous battle with cancer, surrounded by loved ones. Listed here are Dave's awards for his contribution to the nudist community: Alonzo Stevens' GAT Award; Past AANR Family of the Year; Past AANR-NW Man of the Year 2013 & 2016; AANR-NW President's Meritorious Award; Past AANR-NW Vice-President; Past AANR-NW President

Presidents' Feedback - need more advertising to grow the clubs, would like AANR more visible to their members, would like AANR visible beyond the clubs . Of note are some suggestions by Kane:

"I would love to see AANR NW work with the clubs to organize more diverse festivals/ events that go beyond basic club activities but can still be cost efficient- members are looking for memorable experiences that go beyond just socializing by the pool naked."

"to see AANR NW empower local groups, clubs, Meetups to organize and be recognized by AANR, young adults and young families just do not have the time or resources to trek it to the clubs all the time. Ultimately, I would love to see AANR NW be more active and less in the background for not just the clubs, but for all its members and find new innovative ways to promote the fun and healthy benefits that social nudism offers."

Making AANR more visible to club members was another suggestion. Some ideas to go along with that concept are the AANR video Jimmy has started and the flags that indicate which clubs are 100% clubs. We will talk about other ideas during Saturday's meeting. Some presidents also want to have quarterly meetings to talk and troubleshoot ideas.

Welcome to the NW letter-I've created a welcome letter to be sent out to all new NW members. It highlights ways for them to connect here in the NW both online and in person.

Working on getting people connected with the new system-If you have not logged in on the new system, you may not be receiving your emails. I created a YouTube video to help you step-by-step and to also help your members get connected.

Attended the midwinter meeting at Suwanee Valley-There are some fresh ideas and a revamping of old ones for Membership Marketing/Public Relations. Their full reports will be in your club packet, along with a lot of other useful resources. A report from Kane for YADAC, new committee, was presented and he will present at our meeting as well. Kane has jumped in with both feet and is doing amazing work. Of special note is the exhaustive work BG Parkes and her team have been doing to try and find alternate insurance companies that will insure our

nudist clubs. They met with and/or talked to over 50 insurance companies, most of which were uninterested and some even downright rude. Leavitt Insurance who is the parent company of Philadelphia Ins., which is who many of our clubs are insured through, has stated they are moving away from insuring nudist clubs. I will have more information at the time of our meeting.

When Tom and I were in Florida for the midwinter meeting, we were able to visit the main office in Kissimmee, FL. I wanted to put a face with the names of all the people I work with, sometimes on a daily basis. It was wonderful to finally get to give a handshake or a hug to those who are working diligently on our behalf.

February and March we have been talking with so many folks that also winter here. During our conversations we have talked about every club in the Northwest. 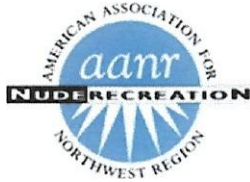

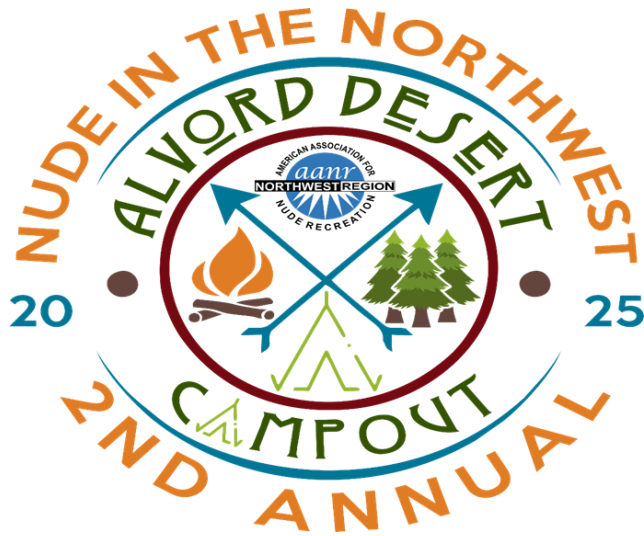

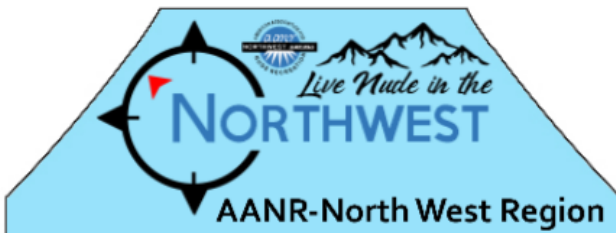

Digital Communications – AANR-NW – Spring Board Meeting 2025

Two years ago, we moved where we hosted our websites in order to provide better mail service to our clubs. We moved to a company (Hostgator) that had been around a long time (2002) and provided the services that we needed. They host over 8 million websites. Since then, they have been sold and have stopped providing some of the services that we depend on (such as automatic backup). They no longer offer the type of hosting that we are using. So when we call for support, it is spotty at best.

We are good through the middle of next March. The renewal price will be ridiculous come March, \$77/month to \$88/month depending on length of service we sign up for. We will need to change. This will be a huge amount of work. We're letting everyone know now. We won't wait until the last moment. We have started looking around. Reseller hosting (what we need) seems to be less available than it has been in the past. If anyone has any recommendations, please let us know.

The aanr-nw.org calendar is now displayed by default in a more compact collapsed layout. We added events to the calendar. Users can filter by club, by AANR-NW events, by major events and other categories. **Clubs can also add their own events to the calendar, and we can import events directly from some other types of club calendars, and some clubs are doing those things. Please contact us to learn how.**

At aanr-nw.org, we updated email forwarders for new club presidents and directors, approved and posted photo contest submissions as they came in, and added new posts of NudeScenes and meeting minutes.

The cpanel that is included as part of our hosting package provides a mechanism for editing websites online.

Nine club websites are being hosted by aanr-nw.org. We handle the domain registration for all of them. We also handle domain registration and email for the Willamettans. We also provide a web site to the AANR Education Foundation. For all of the websites that we host, we also provide up to date SSL certificates (Sites need these for support for secure https pages). Of course, we also host and maintain and produce content for our regional website, aanr-nw.org. Montana Naturists has disbanded but wishes to keep the website for a while in case they can find new leaders. Please let us know if your club would like to take advantage of either free hosting or domain registration service. (dcc@aanr-nw.org)

The AANR-NW Government Affairs Team is tracking bills in legislative sessions of all five states in our Region.

We recently researched and recommended a \$2,000 donation to AANR Government Affairs to support lobbying in Florida for troubling bills aimed a dramatically affecting nude exposure.

In January, our members successfully lobbied to prevent changes to a proposed Oregon Parks regulation change that could have affected users of the nude beaches on the Columbia River at Rooster Rock State Park, east of Portland. The proposed change to Oregon Regulation 52585 would have eliminated the written description of the boundary for nude use, substituting a map which could be changed administratively. Our members wrote emails and testified at a January 15 hearing, leading to withdrawal of that proposal.

To date, two current legislative bills of significant interest to our members have advanced to passage and await Governors' signatures.

Montana HB 82 creates the offense of grooming of a child for a sexual offense; revises certain crimes to include a law enforcement officer whom the offender believed to be a child; revises the offense of sexual abuse of children to include computer generated child pornography; adds the offense of grooming of a child for a sexual offense to the definition of sexual offense. This bill's text is designed to make it easier and more successful to prosecute grooming of children for sexual offenses, and generally tightens prohibitions on nude imagery of children.

Idaho HB 270 dramatically changes the law on indecent exposure. Essentially criminalizing any exposure of genitals or female breasts in public or anywhere a minor might observe the nudity. Letters and other contact was made with Idaho legislators opposing this bill, with little or no impact on its passage.

Additionally, two bills of concern have advanced to the second chamber and appear likely to pass during this session.

Idaho HB 230 creates a civil action regarding indecent sexual exhibitions in the presence of minors. It has passed the house and currently is awaiting action in the Senate.

Montana HB 446 creates new restrictions and harsh criminal penalties for many categories of nude exposure adults to children or children to adults. This bill appears likely to pass both houses of the Legislature.

The text of these bills is appended to this report. No significant bills have advanced in the other three legislatures.

In addition to these activities, AANR-NW President Andee Rogers is working to identify my successor, as I have announced my need to resign as GAT Chair, effective July 1, 2025.

ID HB 270

18-4116. INDECENT EXPOSURE. (1) Every A person is guilty of a misdemeanor if the person who willfully and lewdly, either:

(1) (a) Exposes his or her genitals, ; exposes developed female breasts, including the areola and nipple; exposes adult male breasts, including the areola and nipple, that have been medically or hormonally altered to appear like developing or developed female breasts; exposes artificial breasts, including the areola and nipple, intended to resemble female breasts; or displays toys or products intended to resemble male or female genitals in any public place, or in any place where there is present another person or persons who are offended or annoyed thereby; or

(2) (b) Procures, counsels, or assists any person so to expose his or her genitals, ; to expose developed female breasts, including the areola and nipple; to expose adult male breasts, including the areola and nipple, that have been medically or hormonally altered to appear like d eveloping or developed female breasts; to expose artificial breasts, including the areola and nipple, intended to resemble female breasts; or to display toys or products intended to resemble male or female genitals where there is present another person or persons who are offended or annoyed thereby is guilty of a misdemeanor.

(2) Any person who pleads guilty to or is found guilty of a violation of subsection (1) or (2) of this section or a similar statute in another state or any local jurisdiction for a second third time within five (5) years, notwithstanding the form of the judgment(s) or withheld judgment(s), is guilty of a felony and shall may be imprisoned in the state prison for a period not to exceed ten (10) five (5) years.

(3) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the breastfeeding of a child or the expression of breast milk for the purpose of feeding a child.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage and approval.

MT HB 82

Section 1. Grooming of child for sexual offense. (1) A person commits the offense of grooming of a child for a sexual offense if the person purposely or knowingly engages in a pattern of grooming behavior by any means of communication, including in-person or electronic communication, aimed at a child or the child's guardian with the intent to:

- (a) manipulate the child into engaging in sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (b) coerce or entice a child under 16 years of age to meet in person to engage in sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (c) distribute or facilitate access to sexually explicit material; or
- (d) exploit a position of authority to develop an intimate or secretive relationship with a minor.

(2) (a) Except as provided in subsection (2)(b) or subsection (3), a person convicted of the offense of grooming of a child for a sexual offense shall be imprisoned in the state prison for a term not to exceed 10 years and may be fined not more than \$10,000.

(b) If the victim is under 16 years of age, a person convicted of the offense of grooming of a child for a sexual offense shall be punished by life imprisonment or by imprisonment in the state prison for a term of not less than 4 years or more than 100 years and may be fined not more than \$10,000.

(3) (a) If the victim was 12 years of age or younger and the offender was 18 years of age or older at the time of the offense, the offender:

(i) shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for a term of 100 years. The court may not suspend execution or defer imposition of the first 25 years of a sentence of imprisonment imposed under this subsection (3)(a)(i) except as provided in 46-18-222(1) through (5), and during the first 25 years of imprisonment, the offender is not eligible for parole. The exception provided in 46-18-222(6) does not apply.

(ii) may be fined an amount not to exceed \$50,000; and

(iii) shall be ordered to enroll in and successfully complete the educational phase and the cognitive and behavioral phase of a sexual offender treatment program provided or approved by the department of corrections.

(b) If the offender is released after the mandatory minimum period of imprisonment, the offender is subject to supervision by the department of corrections for the remainder of the offender's life and shall participate in the program for continuous, satellite-based monitoring provided for in 46-23-1010.

(4) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:

(a) "Electronic communication" means a sign, a signal, writing, an image, a sound, data, or intelligence of any nature transmitted or created in whole or in part by a wire, radio, electromagnetic, photoelectronic, or photo-optical system.

(b) "Grooming" means behavior that seeks to prepare, induce, or persuade a minor to engage in sexual activity or other forms of exploitation, even if no meeting or sexual act is completed. It is the deliberate act of establishing an emotional connection with a minor through manipulation, trust-building, or influence to facilitate future sexual abuse or exploitation. This includes online or in-person activities, use of third parties, or indirect methods to facilitate the manipulation of a child.

(c) "Sexual conduct" means:

(i) actual or simulated:

(A) sexual intercourse, whether between persons of the same or opposite sex, as defined in 1-1-201;

(B) penetration of the vagina or rectum by any object, except when done as part of a recognized medical procedure;

(C) bestiality;

(D) masturbation;

(E) sadomasochistic abuse;

(F) lewd exhibition of the genitals, breasts, pubic or rectal area, or other intimate parts of a person; or

(G) defecation or urination for the purpose of the sexual stimulation of the viewer; or

(ii) the depiction or observation of a child in the nude or in a state of partial undress with the purpose to abuse, humiliate, harass, or degrade the child or to arouse or gratify the person's own sexual response or desire or the sexual response or desire of any person.

(d) "Simulated" means any depiction of the genitals or pubic or rectal area that gives the appearance of sexual conduct or incipient sexual conduct.

Section 2. Section 45-5-504, MCA, is amended to read:

"45-5-504. Indecent exposure. (1) A person commits the offense of indecent exposure if the person knowingly or purposely exposes the person's genitals or intimate parts by any means, including electronic communication as defined in 45-5-625(5)(a), under circumstances in which the person knows the conduct is likely to cause affront or alarm in order to:

(a) abuse, humiliate, harass, or degrade another; or

(b) arouse or gratify the person's own sexual response or desire or the sexual response or desire of any person.

(2) (a) A person convicted of the offense of indecent exposure shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$500 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term of not more than 6 months, or both.

(b) On a second conviction, the person shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$1,000 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term of not more than 1 year, or both.

(c) On a third or subsequent conviction, the person shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$10,000 or be imprisoned in a state prison for a term of not more than 10 years, or both.

(3) (a) A person commits the offense of indecent exposure to a minor if the person commits an offense under subsection (1) and the person knows the conduct will be observed by a person who is under 16 years of age or a person, including a law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the offender believes to be a child who is under 16 years of age and the offender is more than 4 years older than the victim or purported victim.

(b) A person convicted of the offense of indecent exposure to a minor shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$50,000 or be imprisoned in the state prison for a term of not less than 4 years, unless the judge makes a written finding that there is good cause to impose a term of less than 4 years and imposes a term of less than 4 years, or more than 100 years, or both."

Section 3. Section 45-5-601, MCA, is amended to read:

"45-5-601. Prostitution -- patronizing prostitute -- exception. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2)(a), the offense of prostitution is committed if a person engages in or agrees or offers to engage in sexual intercourse or sexual contact that is direct and not through clothing with another person for compensation, whether the compensation is received or to be received or paid or to be paid.

(2) (a) A prostitute may be convicted of prostitution only if the prostitute engages in or agrees or offers to engage in sexual intercourse with another person for compensation, whether the compensation is received or to be received or paid or to be paid. A prostitute who is convicted of prostitution may be fined an amount not to exceed \$500 or be imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed 6 months, or both.

(b) A patron may be convicted of patronizing a prostitute if the patron engages in or agrees or offers to engage in sexual intercourse or sexual contact that is direct and not through clothing with another person for compensation, whether the compensation is received or to be received or paid or to be paid. Except as provided in subsection (3), a patron who is convicted of prostitution shall for the first offense be fined an amount not to exceed \$5,000 or be imprisoned for a term not to exceed 5 years, or both, and for a second or subsequent offense shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$10,000 or be imprisoned for a term not to exceed 10 years, or both.

(3) (a) If the person patronized was a child, whether or not the patron was aware of the child's age, or a person, including a law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the patron believed was a child and the patron was 18 years of age or older at the time of the offense, whether or not the patron was aware of the child's age, the patron offender:

(i) shall be punished by imprisonment in a state prison for a term of 100 years. The court may not suspend execution or defer imposition of the first 25 years of a sentence of imprisonment imposed under this subsection (3)(a)(i) except as provided in 46-18-222, and during the first 25 years of imprisonment, the offender is not eligible for parole.

(ii) may be fined an amount not to exceed \$50,000; and

(iii) shall be ordered to enroll in and successfully complete the educational phase and the cognitive and behavioral phase of a sexual offender treatment program provided or approved by the department of corrections.

(b) If the offender is released after the mandatory minimum period of imprisonment, the offender is subject to supervision by the department of corrections for the remainder of the offender's life and shall participate in the program for continuous, satellite-based monitoring provided for in 46-23-1010.

(4) It is not a violation of this section for a person with an impaired physical ability, physical dysfunction, recent injury, or other disability to engage in sex therapy with a partner surrogate who is working under the supervision of a clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, or clinical professional counselor licensed under Title 37, chapter 39.

(5) It is not a defense in a prosecution under this section that a child consented to engage in sexual activity.

(6) It is not a defense in a prosecution under this section that a defendant believed the child was an adult. Absolute liability, as provided in 45-2-104, is imposed."

Section 4. Section 45-5-625, MCA, is amended to read:

"45-5-625. Sexual abuse of children. (1) A person commits the offense of sexual abuse of children if the person:

- (a) knowingly employs, uses, or permits the employment or use of a child in an exhibition of sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (b) knowingly photographs, films, videotapes, develops or duplicates the photographs, films, or videotapes, or records a child engaging in sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (c) knowingly, by any means of communication, including electronic communication or in person, persuades, entices, counsels, coerces, encourages, directs, or procures a child under 16 years of age or a person a person, including a law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the offender believes to be a child under 16 years of age to engage in sexual conduct, actual or simulated, or to view sexually explicit material or acts for the purpose of inducing or persuading a child to participate in any sexual activity that is illegal;
- (d) knowingly processes, develops, prints, publishes, transports, distributes, sells, exhibits, or advertises any visual or print medium, including a medium by use of electronic communication in which a child is engaged in sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (e) knowingly possesses any visual or print medium, including a medium by use of electronic communication or any computer-generated child pornography in which a child is engaged in sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (f) finances any of the activities described in subsections (1)(a) through (1)(d) and (1)(g), knowing that the activity is of the nature described in those subsections;
- (g) possesses with intent to sell any visual or print medium, including a medium by use of electronic communication in which a child is engaged in sexual conduct, actual or simulated;
- (h) knowingly travels within, from, or to this state with the intention of meeting a child under 16 years of age or a person a person, including a law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the offender believes to be a child under 16 years of age in order to engage in sexual conduct, actual or simulated; or
- (i) knowingly coerces, entices, persuades, arranges for, or facilitates a child under 16 years of age or a person, including a person law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the offender believes to be a child under 16 years of age to travel within, from, or to this state with the intention of engaging in sexual conduct, actual or simulated; or
- (j) knowingly threatens to release, exhibit, or distribute any image or video of a child engaging in sexual conduct, actual or simulated, in order to compel the child to provide additional images or videos of a child engaging in sexual conduct, obtain any item of value, or coerce a child to commit or facilitate any crime.
- (2) (a) Except as provided in subsection (2)(b), (2)(c), or (4), a person convicted of the offense of sexual abuse of children shall be punished by life imprisonment or by imprisonment in the state prison for a term not to exceed 100 years and may be fined not more than \$10,000.
- (b) Except as provided in 46-18-219, if the victim is under 16 years of age or is a person, including a law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the offender believes to be a child under 16 years of age, a person convicted of the offense of sexual abuse of children shall be punished by life imprisonment or by imprisonment in the state prison for a term of not less than 4 years or more than 100 years and may be fined not more than \$10,000.
- (c) Except as provided in 46-18-219, a person convicted of the offense of sexual abuse of children for the possession of material, as provided in subsection (1)(e), shall be fined not to exceed \$10,000 or be imprisoned in the state prison for a term not to exceed 10 years, or both.
- (3) An offense is not committed under subsections (1)(d) through (1)(g) if the visual or print medium is processed, developed, printed, published, transported, distributed, sold, possessed, or possessed with intent to sell, or if the activity is financed, as part of a sexual offender information or treatment course or program conducted or approved by the department of corrections.
- (4) (a) If the victim was 12 years of age or younger or is a person, including a law enforcement officer using an undercover or fictitious identity, whom the offender believed to be 12 years of age or younger and the offender was 18 years of age or older at the time of the offense, the offender:
- (i) shall be punished by imprisonment in a state prison for a term of 100 years. The court may not suspend execution or defer imposition of the first 25 years of a sentence of imprisonment imposed under this subsection (4)(a)(i) except as provided in 46-18-222(1) through (5), and during the first 25 years of imprisonment, the offender is not eligible for parole. The exception provided in 46-18-222(6) does not apply.
- (ii) may be fined an amount not to exceed \$50,000; and
- (iii) shall be ordered to enroll in and successfully complete the educational phase and the cognitive and behavioral phase of a sexual offender treatment program provided or approved by the department of corrections.
- (b) If the offender is released after the mandatory minimum period of imprisonment, the offender is subject to supervision by the department of corrections for the remainder of the offender's life and shall participate in the program for continuous, satellite-based monitoring provided for in 46-23-1010.
- (5) It is not a defense to prosecution under this section that the perceived child is an adult or law enforcement officer.

(5) (6) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:

(a) "Computer-generated child pornography" means any visual depiction of:

(i) an actual minor that has been created, adapted, or modified to portray that minor engaged in prohibited sexual conduct;

(ii) an actual adult that has been created, adapted, or modified to portray that adult as a minor engaged in prohibited sexual conduct; or

(iii) an individual indistinguishable from an actual minor created by the use of artificial intelligence or other computer technology capable of processing and interpreting specific data inputs to portray that individual as a minor engaged in prohibited sexual conduct.

(a) (b) "Electronic communication" means a sign, signal, writing, image, sound, data, or intelligence of any nature transmitted or created in whole or in part by a wire, radio, electromagnetic, photoelectronic, or photo-optical system.

(c) "Indistinguishable", when used with respect to a visual depiction, means virtually indistinguishable, in that the visual depiction is such that an ordinary person viewing the visual depiction would conclude that the visual depiction is of an actual minor engaged in prohibited sexual conduct.

(b) (d) "Sexual conduct" means:

(i) actual or simulated:

(A) sexual intercourse, whether between persons of the same or opposite sex, as defined in 1-1-201;

(c) (e) "Simulated" means any depicting of the genitals or pubic or rectal area that gives the appearance of sexual conduct or incipient sexual conduct.

(d) (f) "Visual medium" means:

(i) any film, photograph, videotape, negative, slide, or photographic reproduction that contains or incorporates in any manner any film, photograph, videotape, negative, or slide; or

(ii) any disk, diskette, or other physical media that allows an image to be displayed on a computer or other video screen and any image transmitted to a computer or other video screen by telephone line, cable, satellite transmission, or other method."

6-3902. CIVIL ACTION. (1) Any person or institution that knowingly organizes, hosts, or performs in a show, exhibition, or performance by a live person before a live audience must take reasonable steps to restrict the access of minors if:

(a) The person or institution has reason to believe that minors are likely to be present; (b) The show, exhibition, or performance involves live persons engaged in sexual conduct; and (c) The show, exhibition, or performance is patently offensive to an average person applying contemporary community standards in the adult community as a whole with respect to what is suitable for minors.

(2)(a) Any minor who is exposed to sexual conduct as a result of a violation of subsection (1) of this section shall have a private cause of action against the person or institution that failed to take reasonable steps to restrict the access of minors.

(b) Any civil action arising under this section shall be commenced according to the provisions of section 5-230, Idaho Code.

(c) Any minor who prevails in an action brought pursuant to this section may recover five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in statutory damages for each violation of this section. The minor may also recover monetary damages from the defendant for all psychological, emotional, economic, and physical harm suffered.

(d) Any minor who prevails in an action brought pursuant to this section is entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs from the defendant.

(e) It shall be an affirmative defense to an action brought pursuant to the provisions of this section when:

(i) The defendant is a host if such host is able to produce a legally enforceable contract signed by the event organizers, performers, or an authorized agent working on behalf of the event organizers or performers when such contract stipulates that performers at the event shall not engage in an exhibition, show, or performance that violates the requirements of subsection (1) of this section while using the facilities provided by the host;

(ii) The parent or legal guardian of a minor fourteen (14) years of age or older accompanies such minor to a ticketed show, exhibition, or performance or has provided prior written consent for such minor to attend a ticketed show, exhibition, or performance in the company of a designated adult; or (iii) The defendant had reasonable cause to believe that the minor involved was eighteen (18) years of age or older, or such minor exhibited to the defendant a draft card, driver's license, birth certificate, or other official or apparently official document purporting to establish that the minor was eighteen (18) years of age or older.

(f) It shall not be a defense to an action brought pursuant to this section that the minor was accompanied by the minor's parent or legal guardian, except as provided in paragraph (e)(ii) of this subsection.

(3) When either the attorney general or the county prosecuting attorney for the jurisdiction has reason to believe that any person or institution is violating, has violated, or is about to violate the requirements of subsection (1) of this section, the attorney general or such county prosecuting attorney shall have a cause of action for injunctive relief. The injunction shall be sufficient to prevent the defendant from violating the requirements of this section.

(4) For purposes of this section:

(a) "Host" means to knowingly provide the facilities for a show, exhibition, or performance involving live persons engaged in sexual conduct.

(b) "Minor" means any person less than eighteen (18) years of age.

(c) "Organize" means to knowingly participate in the planning for a show, exhibition, or performance involving live persons engaged in sexual conduct.

(d)(i) "Sexual conduct" means:

1. Acts, whether actual or simulated, of masturbation, sexual intercourse, or physical contact with a person's unclothed genitals or pubic area;

2. Sexually explicit depictions of acts described in subparagraph (i)1. of this paragraph; or

3. Sexually provocative dances or gestures performed with accessories that exaggerate male or female primary or secondary sexual characteristics.

(ii) "Sexual conduct" shall not include dances or gestures performed by an athletic, cheer, or dance team maintained or sponsored by a secondary school or an institution of higher education, provided that the dances or gestures are performed in association with or in conjunction with an interscholastic, intercollegiate, intramural, or club athletic event featuring teams that are sponsored by the secondary school or the institution of higher education.

(5) The provisions of this section are hereby declared to be severable and if any provision of this section or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance is declared invalid for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this section.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect thirty days following signature by the Governor.

The AANR NW Hall of Fame Committee is again seeking nominations for our regional association's highest award. The deadline for submissions is May 1, 2025. The AANR NW Hall of Fame award is given only for services of a magnitude above average to AANR, AANR NW and nudism. Many regions name this award the Lifetime Achievement Award, to better distinguish it from the Man or Woman of the Year award and to indicate the level of accomplishment and volunteerism this award is meant to recognize.

To be eligible, an individual must have had continuous membership in a club or AANR for at least ten years, with a minimum of five years in AANR-NW. An individual member, a group of members or a club can make nominations for the Hall of Fame.

Many of you know someone you might nominate for this award. The nomination process is easy – and something you can do to recognize the contributions of your fellow members. We appreciate the contributions of our many volunteers and all too often remind ourselves we should have nominated someone after the award is announced or goes un-awarded. This year take the time now to say thank you to a special volunteer by completing a nomination form. Help AANR NW recognize our volunteers.

PROPOSED CHANGE TO AANR-NW BYLAWS

FOR VOTE AT 2025 GENERAL ASSEMBLY

ARTICLE XVI

Amendments: Proposed bylaw amendments shall be submitted to the member clubs 45 days prior to the general assembly meeting. Amendments to these bylaws shall become effective upon approval by 3/4 of the delegates voting at the general assembly meeting. Add: **Major changes to the regional Articles of Incorporation shall be made in the same manner. Address update to the Articles of Incorporation may be made by 2/3 vote of the regional board of directors.**

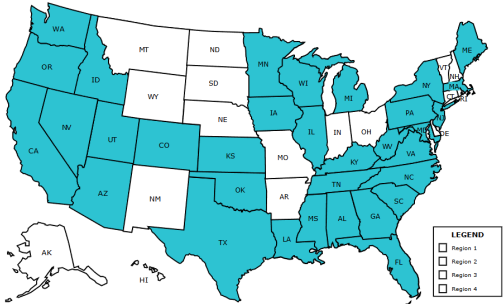

AANR Midwinter Meeting

YADAC Report 1/31/2025

-The Young Adult and Diversity Advisory Council (YADAC) understands the ages that AANR defines as “young adults” but really focuses on them as 18–35-year-olds to be inclusive to young families. YADAC consists of members of varying schedules, some are actively involved while others stand as a source for suggestions and ideas. We meet every other month and chat through messaging apps to each other in the meantime. Each project has their own leadership team, typically 1-3 people

YADAC has a lot of great projects happening within the last few months that we believe will help attract more diverse demographics such as:

1. We are in the final stages of **our Discord project**, an invite-only instant messaging and social platform that allows communication through voice calls, video calls, text messaging, and media. There are immense benefits to using Discord such as it being a free platform to use with no limited restrictions to video calls, used by a huge number of young adults globally, extremely customizable on the back end, user-friendly, and can be partially moderated with AI. Instead of emails, links, attachments found in emails, Zoom links, Substack chats and landing pages, etc, Discord can bring this all in one space. Discord is also privately owned and thus less likely to be influenced by political preferences.
 - a. We use Discord to communicate with each other in the Council, our own private server, and to brainstorm ideas, make suggestions, organize and delegate tasks, and make jokes because at the end of the day we’re also all friends and it’s a great space for us to be a team
 - b. We have Discord server templates for clubs, both landed and non-landed, to easily create and customize their own Discord servers for their specific members so they can interact with each other, attend video calls or classes, see upcoming events, understand any changes or news from the club, etc all in real-time. This information for clubs, along with basic tutorials to assist clubs with Discord, would be housed under club resources on the AANR website.
 - c. The AANR HQ Discord server that will soon be launched will be in beta mode and is structured as a safe space for AANR to communicate and share media that falls within our naturist values. It’s also designed as a potential alternative to the AANR Meet n Greets that makes it much more user friendly, smoother, and way easier for admins. members can join and enter

whichever breakout room they choose, chat with each other, share their screens, whatever.

2. We are in the middle of a larger project which is a **Non-Landed Club Startup Package** that works to assist impassioned young adults in organizing AANR-affiliated non-landed clubs via the AANR website in a more streamlined process, based on interviews with long-lasting non-landed clubs and with people who are just starting up.
 - a. We will do this by creating a set of guidelines, considerations, and suggestions for the club, both in written and recorded video format based on common topics and obstacles.
 - b. Within this online package, there will be downloadable AANR marketing materials for the club to print at their favorite online printing site and supply their members with at their events to promote AANR and its values and display the club's legitimacy.
 - c. We are currently collaborating with AANR West and members of AANR NW (Mike Parker), and with successful, pre-existing AANR-affiliated non-landed clubs to go even further with what we can offer such as:
 - i. Assistance with websites and online presence
 - ii. Initial legal assistance unique to the state and municipality the non-landed club resides in
 - iii. Sponsorships for events
 - iv. Assist in background check procedures
 - v. Event advertisement
 - vi. A non-landed liaison to help answer questions, provide feedback, and assisting the club to sustain through its critical development period
 - vii. AANR member sign-ups through the non-landed clubs, just like a landed club has now
 - viii. Enhanced pre-existing non-landeds
3. We are putting the final touches on another project called the **AANR Speakers Bureau** which provides a forum for nudists who work outside of the nude recreation industry to host classes and workshops at AANR-affiliated clubs. The Bureau gives speakers an opportunity to share their talents and develop educational programs for nude environments. Likewise, it allows clubs to expand their activity options in ways that can both attract new visitors and increase the frequency of attendance by regulars.

- a. The AANR Speakers Bureau should span a wide array of topics from physical and intellectual growth (exercise classes, writing groups, history and science lectures) to hobbies (art, cooking, gaming) to the practical (tax prep, retirement, parenting, personal finance, investing). Like you would find at a community center, cafe, or bookstore but are instead taught and taken in the nude. To clarify, the Speakers Bureau is *not* the forum for “Nudism 101” classes, discussions about legal rights for nudists, etc.
 - b. This will take the form of a searchable database or online PDF document accessible to the management of AANR-affiliated clubs that will be password-protected. The document will be organized by topic with each speaker’s entry, including the areas/regions they serve. Interested speakers can send their applications to a dedicated e-mail address. Once approved by leadership, the directory’s project manager will add new entries.
4. We are also beginning a new project known as the **College Ambassadors Program** that is aimed for college students or recipients of the Education Foundation Scholarship program who are still in school and would be interested in organizing as an ambassador for their on-campus presence for events, social support, and nude activities.

Plus, much more on the horizon with ideas and brainstorming, just waiting for the completion of some of these projects before we really dive into the nuts and bolts of others, at this time.
