There are 2 flush toilets near the playground. If you're wanting the full rustic experience, the outhouses are located at the end of Nudista way by T1. Rocky's Place, by the Lodge, has a bathroom upstairs and there are 2 porta potties, one at G1 and the other at T5. Please see the map on the back of your program for those locations.

### **Petiquette**

Pets must be on leash at all times and are not allowed on the sunning lawn, the path above the sunning lawn, the lawn near the Pavilion or by Lake Opal. Bags for waste are available near the entrances or in Nudestroms-free of charge. :)

### **Nudestroms**

Our own unique boutique, across from the hot tubs, carries fashions for the discerning nudist, sundries, and souvenirs. We accept cash and credit cards. Open hours will be posted on the door. We also open on request after hours. Ask at the gold-colored cabin near the flagpole.

### **First Aide**

There's a first aide kit and an AED unit just inside the door of the Pavilion directly on your left.

### **NO GLASS CONTAINERS (including beer bottles) ON THE GROUNDS.**

Please smoke tobacco **ONLY IN DESIGNATED AREAS**, your tent or rig. Designated smoking areas are: behind the pavilion, in front of the pavilion by the Native American wood cutouts, near the sunning lawn, or behind Rocky's Place. Behind Rocky's place is the only area designated for smoking marijuana.

Please drink responsibly. Naloxone is available onsite in cabin #18 should the need arise.

We are remote and our Wifi system is limited, so please use it for essential communications only.

# 90 YEARS OF SMR

## NAME CHANGES

Meaning: Western Land

Come with me to the past and see where it all started. Our founding five couples, who met at the showing of Elysia, formed the first nudist group in the Pacific Northwest November 4, 1933, and immediately began looking for property suitable for a nudist park. Fun fact, they took their first nude sunbath in the Gales Creek area December 28, 1933. The very first, organized nudist activity recorded for this area! The group searched for many months before finding a site that met their needs and that they could afford. A tract of land near Estacada.

The sum of \$25.00 was deposited as the first payment March 15, 1934. Two cars, loaded with nudists, made the trip to their future campsite where they found a little clearing and put up a canvas shelter between two trees. Welcome to the first nudist park west of the Mississippi.

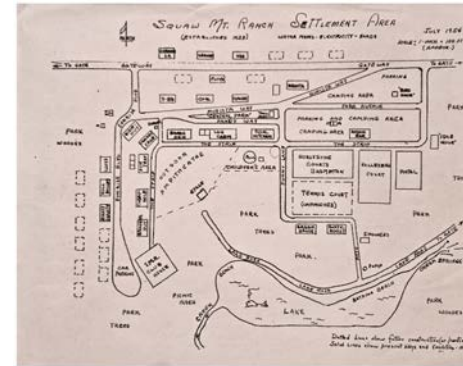
Throughout the years additions of buildings and modern amenities like flush toilets and permanent structures. Tom and Andee's cabin, Serenity, est. 1936 was the first cabin built on grounds. The round-roof cabins, Canary Cage-Dave Arter, Earl's, Robby and Gypsie's, & The Avery's. These cabins were drug down from a logging camp in the 50s. Many more followed and the addition of our Lodge for accommodating guests helped establish revenue to keep the club running.

SMR closed to the public due a lack of liability insurance but also because a biker influence was very evident. Somewhere between 1986-1989 at the convention at Kaniksu Ranch, regional ASA trustee, Wayne Roberts, announced that a contract for the next year needed to be signed or SMR would lose its charter. Allen Keeney, a SMR member, was present and the last elected SMR VP before it closed to the public. They signed the contract. Wayne later went to the club and kicked Marg's (then president) significant other George out. George was a gun carrying ex-con. The biker group also left the club after that.

At the same time, no property taxes had been paid for three years and the club was close to being sold at a tax sale. This was no accident as there was a secret plan for a few to purchase the property for little at the sale. Three other members - Fred Eves, Larry Franck and one other personally put up the funds to pay the taxes to keep the club going. Some of the cabins had collapsed and many others in various states of disrepair.

Work parties to repair the club began and Hidden Springs members even adopted an area above the lake and created a trail then planted roses and other flowers in. The voles eventually destroyed it after a few years.

Sondra Smith was then SunRover president and decided that the SunRovers were going to undertake the rescue of SMR. It was not unanimous. Some SunRover members transferred their basic ASA membership to SMR and bought and refurbished cabins. John and Donna Mollan were among some of those members.

Some time after the club was thriving again, the Pavilion which used to be open to the elements was enclosed approximately to create indoor space for year round meetings, parties, and such. Most recent additions are the community deck with cedar milled on property, and the purchase and renovations of both Old Yeller and Cedarwood. Guest rentals which have been such an incredible asset to SMR and wildly popular with guests.

An Electric gate was added earlier this year making it much easier to enter and exit the club. A huge thanks to Bret and Jenny Agee & the Willamettans for their support and generosity in helping out a sister club.

Leona Wilcox was the most active and influential founding member of SMR. She was awarded the regional Hall of Fame award posthumously in 2007. Leona was vice president of the regional organization that preceded our region (taking in half the country) but was not itself an official region. She and her husband assisted other fledgling clubs in the mid-to late 1930's in creating their own clubs including what became Kaniksu, Tiger Mountain and Lake Bronson, among others. She is rumored to be the woman that got all the information gathered at the "Elysia" movie presentation in 1933 that coalesced into SMR. Thank goodness for the movie Elysia!



Through the decades SMR has survived much: financial troubles, biker gang, inner struggles between members that divided the camp, forest fires, and so much more. Today SMR is a peaceful, serene, thriving club that welcomes you to retreat and enjoy Serenity in our little section of the forest.

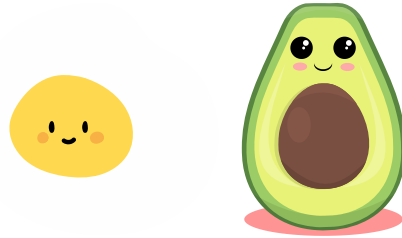

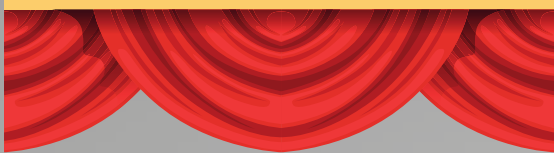
