**President – Donna Jennings**

**Vice-President – Andee Rodgers**

See written report. Also, this week I was contacted by "A Naturist World" to add information to their site about our organization. Over 80% of our members on FaceBook are men, which is problematic because some comments can discourage women from commenting or joining. I'm working to fix that.

**Secretary – Jim Lahey**

**Treasurer – Terri Capshaw**

I handed out a balance sheet and Profit & Loss for 2021 through September, but additional deposits have arrived since it was produced.

The Balance Sheet shows our assets and liabilities. Our assets consist of \$43,981 in checking and savings, \$2998 in fixed equipment assets (which will be written off this year), and \$12,889 in library assets, plus \$61,362, in our restricted legal fund. The total assets are \$121,240. We're also holding a \$1,000 convention bond from Sun Meadow, which will be forfeited by them if they're unable to hold the 2022 convention (See motion 6).

The Profit and Loss report compares income and expenses against budget. The budget column shows nine months (3/4) of the budget. \$5000 in dues came in September and is not included here, so we're actually above budget there at this point. Travel is still missing for the trustee and this board meeting. We still haven't been billed for the most recent issue of the NudeScene. No more expenses from Brand Management are expected this year. DCC and library computer expenses are still expected. Zoom expenses in lieu of face to face meetings have been expensed under Board Host Club. An insurance bill is still expected in December. No one applied for a scholarship this year, so encourage students in your club to apply next year. We show net income almost \$3,500 to the good so far this year.

**2022 Convention and Facilities – Susan Bale**

The convention is planned for Sun Meadow, as a 10 day event, including the Skin to the Wind Festival the previous weekend. However, Sun Meadow is up for sale, and the convention is likely to be moved to another club. See motion 6 below.

**2023 Convention and Facilities – Nilda Miranda**

The convention will be held at Squaw Mountain Resort. Nilda has volunteered as convention coordinator, to work with Squaw Mountain.

**Digital Communications – Jim Lahey**

See written report. Any club that wants to use our Zoom capabilities can contact us. For example, Hidden Springs has been using it for their club meetings.

We presented a review of the aanr-nw.org website to the meeting attendees, showing the new site header and other changes, the photo contest pages, the calendar, and all of the members only area. The meeting minutes and reports and the NudeScenes were discussed. The minutes are just being put here for member access rather than sending an e-mail with 15+ attachments to 40+ inboxes around the region. The reports can be read, searched, downloaded and printed from there. The NudeScenes are sent out electronically and with the printed Bulletins by AANR, with all old ones available here also. The calendar was also demonstrated and clubs were asked to post their events there or provide event text to us.

**Finance – Terri Capshaw for Nilda Malloy**

We weren't able to perform an audit in the spring, since that meeting was remote. Therefore, an audit was performed at Sun Meadow when enough people were available. That audit was presented at the Convention, and also here, and is attached as a report. A motion to approve the audit will be presented later in the meeting.

**Government affairs – Dave Smith**

No report. No problems occurring.

**Hall of Fame – Mike Parker**

The deadline for Hall of Fame and other honor awards is May 1. Please consider nominating someone. **Selection of the site and time** for the 2022 spring board meeting.

We have one bid, from Squaw Mountain Ranch. Andee Rodgers spoke for Squaw Mountain. They plan to have an Irish theme, with Irish meals, entertainment and games. They have never held a spring board meeting, but they have held fall board meetings. There was a question of whether their Wi-Fi is sufficient for a hybrid meeting, and they believe it will be. They proposed to hold the meeting either of the first two weekends of April. The second weekend is more convenient to a couple of board members, so that was selected.

**Motion 5** - I move to name Squaw Mountain Ranch as the host club for the 2022 Spring Board Meeting on April 8-10, 2022.

**Motion 6** - I move to name a new club to host the 2022 Convention and General Assembly. If we get bids, the president will call for an interim Zoom board meeting to decide whether and which bid to accept. The bond provided by Sun Meadow will be forfeited, and the region may choose to leave those funds in the general fund or use them to help the newly selected club in holding the convention on shorter notice.

**Purpose:** Sun Meadow is trying to sell, and doesn't expect to be able to host, so they proposed this procedure to avoid uncertainty and allow sufficient time for planning to happen properly. We have a couple of directors who expressed interest in pursuing this with their clubs.

Sun Meadow were the people who proposed that they should forfeit the bond, even if the convention happens successfully. Squaw Mountain Ranch proposed that their grounds could be used if any travel clubs wish to bid to run the convention.

## Saturday discussion notes

- AANR-NW Trustee updates Karen Lahey

There was a description of AANR actions since the AANR-NW convention, including at the AANR convention. See the trustee report. AANR Membership Marketing/PR committees submitted a proposal that the Social Media Guidelines prepared by the committees be adopted as a guideline for the AANR office and AANR leadership and be recommended to the AANR Regions and our clubs and membership. This proposal was approved by the Trustees. There was a vote to put club welcoming message on the AANR website similar to the one on the AANR-NW website, but this was voted down. Motions to change the term of “associate members” to “direct members”, and club descriptions from “non-landed” to “travel” and “landed” to “destination” were voted down but the “direct Members” change will be on next year’s member ballot. WINR was discussed. There is a new aanr.com website coming soon.

- NudeScene / DCC updates Jim Lahey

Some people are not getting NudeScene issues on-line so we gathered a list of who is or is not getting it, and we’ll check with AANR about why.

- Government Affairs Team Dave Smith

GAT continues to track proposed bills that might affect nudism. If anyone hears of bills or other happenings that might affect us, please let GAT know, via [gat@aanr-nw.org](mailto:gat@aanr-nw.org). GAT is working to support nude beaches in Hawaii, since state parks department seems to be trying to close nudity at beaches such as Little Beach. There is also the issue of privacy related to Apple changes related to defining and searching for child pornography. Donna covered this in her president’s report.

- WINR-Women in Nude Recreation Andee Rodgers

Now that WINR has produced a women’s brochure, they’re discussing a men’s brochure discussing topics like proper behavior, body acceptance issues, and what to expect, and a safety flyer similar to the women’s safety flyer.

- Scholarship Heidi Grist

We had 3 requests for scholarship application forms but none of the students returned the applications. Remind students at your clubs to apply for this.

- Historian, Legislation, Library Mike Parker

The library plans to acquire the equipment authorized by the board in the spring including a computer and a scanner. A television was already donated. There is no legislation proposed in this meeting. If anyone has legislation that they would like the board to consider in spring, please submit it by February.

- Budget Discussion Teri Capshaw

We held the budget planning meeting Friday night, and handed out the new proposed budget with the changes from that meeting. That budget will be voted on tomorrow.

- Rap Session

Donna discussed the Apple announcements relating to adding scans on phones and computers for what they consider child endangerment or pornography, and pushback that is happening concerning this.

Montana Naturists has disbanded and has contributed their funds of \$1753.10 to the AANR-NW legal defense fund and an identical amount to the AANR legal defense fund.

There was a discussion of convention requirements and fees. Terri, Margie, Dave, Andee, and Jim volunteered to be part of a committee to consider convention contract changes. Since Sun Meadow may be sold, we have a problem of where to hold next year's convention. Squaw Mountain may be able to move their convention up a year. We will consider a motion tomorrow to ask clubs to submit bids within 6 weeks for next year's convention and for the board to hold an interim Zoom meeting soon after to select one or confirm our action.

Robare Smith, the founder of the new Columbia River Sun, described how his club is going. It's doing very well. They've got 12 members now. They've had a lot of events this summer, including events at Sun Meadow, Omak, the beach at Vantage, and blueberry picking with Wandering Bare.

Squaw Mountain has been active this summer, with a lot of events.

Kaniksu Ranch construction is continuing. They plan to open on their usual schedule next year, and to hold their BBFR on the last Sunday in July, as usual.

SLUGS has been mostly inactive. The spa they used to rent has now gone out of business, and they haven't started up movie nights yet. There have been a few hikes.

Sun Rovers have been having some smaller events. They're interested in using a calendar that can be imported into the AANR-NW calendar.

Bare Mountain has taken out their pool due to leaks and put in a much nicer one with a new larger deck. They held their Streak to the Peak in September as originally scheduled.

## Rules of Business for Hybrid On-Site and On-Line Meetings for the AANR-NW Region

“Where there is radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views, gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal.”

Henry Robert, *Parliamentary Law*

The business meeting will be recorded. This meeting is being run as a hybrid meeting, with some members at a meeting site and others by video conference. These rules are slightly modified to accommodate this format.

### MOTION PROCEDURES:

Motions are to be written and e-mailed or presented on-site to the president and to the secretary, and the secretary will transcribe the e-mailed motions to an AANR-NW Motion Form. One person needs to make the motion and one needs to second unless put forth by a committee. Whenever possible, the motion will be shown to the on-line board members via camera, scan or program.

When a motion is up for discussion:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can “move the previous question” which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable and requires a 2/3rds vote to adopt.

On August 6, the Apple Corporation announced a new Apple Child Protective Policy with two new policies scheduled to go into effect this year (2021).

The first policy allows parents of children less than 13 years of age to "opt in" and monitor any attempts by their child to download any content related to nudity/pornography/sexting on to the child's phone.

The second and more concerning policy allows Apple to access any adult's phone to search for any pictorial content which depicts evidence supporting childhood sexual abuse. This measure is supported by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. There is a certain number of "threshold" photos allowed prior to triggering a "cloud alert" serial number under the header of "Photo DNA". Apple is using the term "Child Sex Abuse Material" also known as "CSAM".

A week later, Reuters reported that more than 90 policy and civil right groups around the world published an open letter urging Apple to abandon their plans for scanning children's messages for nudity and the phones of adults for images of child sex abuse. "Though these capabilities are intended to protect children and reduce the spread of child abuse, we are concerned that they will be used to censor protected speech, threaten the privacy and security of people around the world and have disastrous consequences for many children."

As of mid-September, the nudist community has not yet come together to issue a common response, but there are private concerns within the leadership of various nudist organizations and clubs that this new program will affect the abilities of such organizations through shared photos, newsletters, websites and blogs.

GAT is monitoring this situation closely and I expect to hear more feedback in the near future. I will keep the Northwest members informed of the latest updates on this matter.

## Trustee Report

The AANR Convention at Star Ranch was the first in person meeting that our board has had since Covid. The meetings were held as hybrid meetings. Two of the trustees were not in Texas, but attended via Zoom. Three of the Regional Presidents and the GAT chair, Tim Mullins, were also on Zoom. This setup worked, even when we needed to adjourn to executive session. Being able to meet in person has the advantage of having impromptu conversations that further relationships as well as foster new ideas. However, Zoom allows those that cannot attend to participate in the governance of the organization. This is an ongoing tension that we will continue to need to balance at both the AANR and the regional levels.

There is a new aanr.com website under development, done on a volunteer basis by George Oberle, a member the AANR Membership Marketing Committee and developer of the NaturistHub social media website. The latest word that I have on the new website is that the new content is to be ready by October 1<sup>st</sup>.

AANR Membership Marketing/PR committees submitted a proposal that the Social Media Guidelines prepared by the committees be adopted as a guideline for the AANR office and AANR leadership and be recommended to the AANR Regions and our clubs and membership. This proposal was approved by the Trustees. While we have not experienced the problems of bullying or using pictures without approvals in our regions, it has happened in other places in the organization. We need to continue to be vigilant. We are looking to see if we can find professional training on how to use social media as a successful marketing tool. We are also looking for training on how to handle social media bullying.

Membership Marketing/PR submitted a proposal that AANR publish a welcoming statement like we have on the aanr-nw.org website. AANR-Florida is also moving forward with such a proposal. In preparing this proposal we contacted a number of clubs that agreed with this statement. However, the Trustees defeated this proposal by a vote of 4 to 3 for varying reasons. Some of the reasons were that 'some clubs are restricted to adults only' or 'some clubs have various restrictions on singles', and that the statement doesn't let them say what their exceptions are. Emotions ran high. They wanted clubs to be more specific about what they did accept. This will be provided on the AANR website. Rather than fighting an uphill battle, I am working with the AANR Office to get this implementation done as quickly as possible, so that clubs can advertise their welcoming position.

Membership Marketing/PR submitted a proposal that AANR change the term 'associate' members to 'direct' members. The board and audience encouraged us to continue to get this change made. The first step is a bylaw change to change the wording in the AANR bylaws. This request has been made. This change, if accepted, will require changes in the wording in our ruling documents.

Membership Marketing/PR submitted a proposal that AANR rename 'landed' clubs as 'destination' clubs and 'non-landed' clubs as 'travel' clubs. The board and audience encouraged us to continue to get this change made. However the combined committees did not want to make these changes. There would not have been time to get the bylaw change request made and get the combined committees to approve the change, so none of these changes will happen.

The mid-winter board meeting will be at Cyprus Cove in Florida during the first week in February, 2022. Next year's convention will be at Suwannee Valley Resort in Florida. In two years, the convention will be at Solair in Connecticut.

## Digital Communications – AANR-NW – Fall Board Meeting 2021

- Our last e-news mailing went to 1188 valid recipients, down slightly from before the convention. The mailings include a list of the events at clubs around the region for the following month, along with other news items. The items in the event list also include links to the club websites. With fewer events and some clubs still closed due to the pandemic for the last year+, we haven't been sending out as many mailings as usual, but we will be returning to a more regular schedule. The open rate (the per cent of mailings being opened by the recipients) is running about 31%, a very high rate in general for bulk mailings. 15% of those who opened it clicked on at least one link and visited one of more external sites; this is an excellent rate, indicating the number of members who are actively reading the mailings and investigating further, including being sent to club web sites.
- The aanr-nw.org calendar is now displayed by default in a more compact collapsed layout. We added events to the calendar. Users can filter by club, by AANR-NW events, by major events and other categories. **Clubs can also add their own events to the calendar, and we can import events directly from some other types of club calendars, and some clubs are doing those things. Please contact us to learn how.**
- At aanr-nw.org, we fixed the club page and map, improved the header and look and feel and made general fixes and updates. We also improved the picture gallery, updated the 2021 photo contest page, added a new page and support for 2022 photo contest submissions, and added new posts of NudeScenes and meeting minutes. **The picture gallery support is available for free to all of our hosted websites.**
- The cpanel that is included as part of our hosting package provides a mechanism for editing websites online.
- Nine club websites are being hosted by aanr-nw.org. We handle the domain registration for all of them. We also handle domain registration and email for the Willamettans. We also provide a web site to the AANR Education Foundation. For all of the websites that we host, we also provide up to date SSL certificates (Sites need these for support for secure https pages). Of course, we also host and maintain and produce content for our regional website, aanr-nw.org. ### **From a Man's Perspective content:**

Most people visiting a nudist club for the first time have questions or concerns. Here are some answers to questions that men may have in order to make the first visit comfortable.

**What to bring?** Clubs, events and conditions will vary, but having a towel to sit on at all times is basic nudist etiquette. You will need a picture ID especially if this is a first visit. Many clubs offer first time visitors free entry so that you get to know the club, and they get to know you. And don't forget sunscreen, particularly for parts that are usually covered.

**Plan ahead, call ahead.** Once you've decided on a club for your first visit, it's always good to review their website and then contact them and ask questions so you know what to expect. Each club has its own policies regarding admission, activities, facilities, and the consumption of alcohol. Ask if you have a specific question. Are any events planned? What facilities are offered? Is it a clothing optional or clothes free resort? Are there activities for your children? What are their admission and singles policies? Are your pets allowed? Are rooms or campgrounds for overnight stays available? Are reservations required? What are the costs? Remember, plan your day out, getaway weekend, or vacation as you would any other. The more you know, the more comfortable you'll feel when you arrive.

**Understand there are two types of nudist clubs: landed and non-landed or event club.** Landed clubs have their own grounds and facilities and may be luxurious or rustic. Non-landed/event or travel clubs have members who often meet at a private home or somewhere in their community. They may also meet at a beach, nude bike ride, top-free event, leased space like a pool or bowling alley or a nude cruise. Or they might travel together to a landed club.

**OK, let's get down to it.** Here are some questions men frequently ask:

**"How will I compare to others?"** Body image is a concern to most people but they discover this to be mostly irrelevant at nudist events. Body acceptance is the norm. Nudists value who you are as a person; they don't care about what you look like. Nudists come in all ages, sizes and conditions. You are fine as you are.

**"What about erections?"** Most men quickly learn that it does not occur in the non-sexual environment of a nudist gathering. Of course, we're human, and that's another reason to carry a towel which could cover an unexpected occurrence.

**"Is this a place to make dates?"** Nudists often make lifelong friends but a naturist resort is not a dating service. One shouldn't go with the sole expectation of finding dates. Once singles get to know each other, their friendship may progress. However, unwanted advances or other type of inappropriate behavior is unacceptable and may be grounds for being asked to leave. Be assured that once the clothes come off, we are all more or less equal. The only way to communicate is to talk to each other, make eye contact and smile.

**I'm interested but my partner/spouse is resistant.** First, be upfront about your desire to share what you may have found as an enjoyable environment, where people are accepted for who they are, not what they do or wear. Remember that some people have negative ideas about being nude that they learned as a child. If the club allows an adjustment time for a first-time visitor to remain covered, encourage your partner/spouse to have a short, check-it-out visit. No obligation. Get a tour of the facility or enjoy a planned event. Without feeling pressured, there may be more willingness to see what it is all about and to learn that it is more comfortable to be nude. There may even be members who are particularly sensitive to the partner's concerns and available to talk or meet privately.

Remember: Nudity is wonderful. Water flows freely over your entire body when you swim, the sun bathes your skin and the wind wraps its arms around you. It is healthy, wholesome and family friendly. For some, it is spiritual. It is as nature intended.

To all our guests: (taken from the Willamettans)

We want you to have a great time while you're here.

But if your great time makes another person uncomfortable, you may be behaving inappropriately. Here are some tips to help everyone have a great time:

- Sexually suggestive language, speech, or behavior, including dancing, are never appropriate.
- Public displays of affection should be discreet and family friendly.
- Voyeurism, leering, or other inappropriate conduct can be grounds for immediate and permanent removal from the grounds.
- Get permission before touching someone who is not in your family.
- Remember that "no" means "no."
- Undue attention to children who are not your own can be grounds for removal.
- Overuse of alcohol is not appropriate.
- Photography is prohibited without express permission from management.

The memories created here can all be happy ones.
