Public Lands – Mike Parker

We have two volunteers to organize the two beach cleanups. Andee Rodgers from Serenity Mountain Retreat (Squaw Mountain Ranch) will coordinate the 2023 Rooster Rock beach clean-ups and Liz Nase of Mountaindale Sun Resort will do the Collins Beach ones. They also organized the 2022 cleanups. It still would be good to have a public lands chair to deal with the rest of public lands such as forests, hot springs, and parks. Please ask at your clubs to see if anyone would like to get involved, with Mike's guidance.

Another issue concerning public lands came up later in the meeting and is being reported here. We have an issue that came up two days ago. An individual in Oregon, Louis Michael, sent a letter complaining formally about nude hiking by Wandering Bare in Willamette Valley Wildlife Refuge. Nude activities on public lands are legal in Oregon. It came to Donna Jennings, who forwarded it to Dave Smith, Mike Parker, AANR president Erich Shuttauf and others. Wandering Bare responded positively to her and Donna Jennings will also respond with a short positive reply, with input from Mike and Erich. This should stay in email and not Facebook. We also should encourage Wandering Bare to continue to be respectful and cover up if they run into others.

Scholarship – Heidi Grist

We awarded a \$1000 scholarship to Danielle Logan from Kaniksu Ranch. Applications are available for next year's scholarship. Applications are due by May 1, and there is accompanying information that needs to be gathered, so students should start that early. The student, parents or grandparents must be AANR members.

Time and Place – Robby Graves

Due to some confusion getting bids in time at the convention, no site for the 2024 convention was selected and that will happen today. We received one application for the 2024 convention, from the Willamettans. We received two bids for the spring board meeting, from the Sun Meadow Sun Seekers and from Mountaindale Sun Resort. We will select the site and dates for those during new business. Other clubs should consider bidding for future meetings. Applications must be submitted at least 15 days before a board meeting for the following board meeting, or 15 days before a convention for the convention two years later. 2024 Convention Site Selection

Jim Renner spoke for the Willamettans regarding the 2024 Convention. We will provide a 10x30 ft tent for the meeting area. We have the pool, hot tub, sauna, shuffleboard, tennis, pickle ball, bocce ball, volleyball, pool table, ping pong. The café and fireside bar will be open. The activity committee is already planning activities. Wifi is available. We have two shower buildings. We're about 35 miles from the airport and 20 miles from the bus station. Cell service is spotty, so we recommend wifi calling. We have at least one cell tower booster, but depending on use, it can be spotty. There will be open house at the library. There will be a band and other entertainment. We'll likely take reservations 6 months in advance.

New Business

We have two bids for the spring 2023 board meeting.

Bruce DeLoria spoke on behalf of Mountaindale Sun Club. The proposed dates are April 13-16. Meeting area is in the club house. Ground fees are \$15/day and exempted for board members and officers. Meals will be available. Activities will be provided each evening. Phone service and wifi is good in the meeting area.

Terri Capshaw spoke on behalf of the Sun Meadow Sun Seekers. We're a travel club but also a neighborhood (Sun Meadow Estates) with houses close to each other adjacent to the former Sun Meadow Nudist Club, so this will be an experiment. We're proposing that we will house and feed you in our subdivision. We have several people that can provide RV sites, and the park is still available and has (non-nudist) RV sites. The park also has rooms, and we will put up people in our homes. One neighbor has a large shop with bathrooms that can hold easily about 20 people for meetings and entertainment. Friday and Saturday dinners would likely be progressive dinners across several neighbors' homes. Breakfasts and lunches will be at the Jennings' home. There will be hot tubbing available at several residences and there will be a DJ dance. The club will only charge \$20 per person, to cover food and lodging for the entire weekend. Cell phone and wi-fi is good. The dates would be April 14-16. With enough notice we should be able to shuttle people from the Spokane airport. We also think the casino may still provide shuttles from the airport to the casino, and we could shuttle from there.

Vote was 5-4 for Sun Meadow Sun Seekers. We thank both clubs for their bids.

Motion 4 - I move to host the AANR-NW 2023 Spring Board meeting on April 14-16 2023 at Sun Meadow Sun Seekers travel club.

There was a budget meeting Friday night that prepared a proposed 2023 budget. The budget was presented and discussed in Saturday's meeting. The budget proposed is a negative \$4300. Usually, our budget is not all spent and the excess is still available after that, and we do have a stockpile of cash, as shown in our balance sheet, which is why we feel comfortable budgeting in the red sometimes. As a non-profit, we don't want to keep growing our balance and we want to spend it.

There will be a poetry slam at the convention for the first time, led by John Mollen. Other activities include a poker run and a team drag race.

Rules of Business for Hybrid On-Site and On-Line Meetings for the AANR-NW Region

“Where there is radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views, gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal.”

Henry Robert, *Parliamentary Law*

The business meeting will be recorded. This meeting is being run as a hybrid meeting, with some members at a meeting site and others by video conference. These rules are slightly modified to accommodate this format.

MOTION PROCEDURES:

Motions are to be written and e-mailed or presented on-site to the president and to the secretary, and the secretary will transcribe the e-mailed motions to an AANR-NW Motion Form. One person needs to make the motion and one needs to second unless put forth by a committee. Whenever possible, the motion will be shown to the on-line board members via camera, scan or program.

When a motion is up for discussion:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can “move the previous question” which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable and requires a 2/3rds vote to adopt.

In August I attended the AANR 2022 Convention at Suwannee Valley Resort in White Springs Florida. BG Parkes and her team did an outstanding job in running a fun and very productive convention despite extended power outages and frog strangling rainstorms!

BG put together a comprehensive Strategic Plan for AANR for the upcoming year. A copy of this plan will be provided in the FBM packet.

The Regional Presidents and the Regional AANR Trustees will increase the number of their meetings to four times a year. Two in person meetings are currently held each year and two additional Zoom meetings will be added to foster improved communication within the entire organization.

Bob Roche and BG Parkes were voted into the AANR Hall of Fame.

You will notice an ad in The Bulletin for the next few months called "Wreaths Across America" to honor the lives of our fallen veterans. For a \$15.00 purchase price, a wreath will be placed on a veteran's grave in a National Cemetery of your choosing. The GAT Team will be switching from Fiscal Note to State Net in the next few weeks to better identify potential legislation which may negatively impact nudism by being poorly written or with unintended consequences. Having worked with the old system myself, it was quite cumbersome to read through all the bills. The new system should streamline this problem for all the Regional GAT Chairs.

Erich Schuttauf gave an impassioned speech about the alarming increase in the number of anti-nudity bills AANR is seeing introduced across the United States as well as the threat of formerly nudist friendly beaches and venues losing their status and turning into clothed areas. The 2023 legislative year should be challenging. I urge all members to be vigilant to monitor their city and county local politicians for any anti-nudity legislation being introduced within your community and to contact me or Dave Smith immediately!

The new "Know Before You Go" brochure designed by Andee and Tom Rodgers and their team was very well received at the AANR convention as is available for download by all clubs through AANR.com

In closing, I hope you all had a productive and fun summer- it just went by way too fast!

At the **General Assembly** (members meeting), there are two main things that happen. The interim motions are ratified by the membership and awards are given. This year, all but one of the interim motions were ratified without discussion. The interim motion where the board encouraged Kathy Watzel to put her name on the ballot for Trustee for the West (we believed her to have valid credentials) was opposed by Bev Price. However, this interim motion was also ratified by a majority of 23 to 5.

President’s Award - This award is issued at the discretion of the AANR President and is presented to a person, couple or group deemed by the President to have performed meritorious service to AANR.

There are two board meetings during conventions on years when there is an election.

The **Outgoing board** meeting is comprised of the members of the old board. Action taken by the outgoing board were to approve the only applicant for the 2024 convention at De Anza Springs and the only applicant for the 2023 mid-winter board meeting at Lake Como.

The name of the Alonzo Steven’s GAT Award was renamed to be the Government Affairs Memorial Award in recognition that many other people are worthy of recognition of honor in serving GAT

We also added reimbursement of up to \$35 per diem for meals purchased at the host club for officers, trustees and appointed officials during annual meetings and interim board meetings.

The board decided to require that the ruling documents be reviewed biannually in odd years in order to ensure that they are kept up to date.

Four clubs in AANR-East and one club in AANR – Western Canada had their charters revoked.

The decision was made to no longer allow regional presidents to get the names and contact details for members in their regions. Instead, the AANR office will mail out correspondence for them at no additional cost. This vote passed with a 4 to 3 vote.

During the **incoming board** meeting (with the newly appointed board members), a number of decisions were made.

The decision was made to send a letter to AANR members who have not provided an e-mail address to AANR informing them that in the future they will need to contact the AANR office to get their voter credentials. They will be reminded of this by notices on the website, on social media and on their renewal notices. They will be told that voting happens during every even year. They can be asked to be added to a list where they will be reminded by a letter. This year, sending out personalized voting credentials to these members cost well over \$15,000 and only 25 people voted by phone.

The decision was made to allow the membership marketing committee to work on creating an online make on demand branded store, like AANR-NW has at Zazzle. This is a change. In the past, branded merchandise was not allowed to be sold.

The decision was made to add two online board gatherings in between the two in persons gatherings. These will be timed to happen after the online Regional President's meetings.

The board agreed to sponsor an online Toastmaster's group.

BG Parkes, working with Judy Mason, has negotiated a plan to help clubs with Background Checks. We will discuss this plan on Saturday and the company will present the plan to us via Zoom at a later date. They have also found an insurance company that is happy to work with AANR clubs. I am including a preliminary flyer from both of their companies.

In other news, the Meet and Greets are doing astoundingly well. I think I have a tiger by the tail. Over 1000 nudists have signed up as being interested in the online conversations. During each meeting, we see from 70-125 people discussing topics as diverse as "Nudism and Culture" to "Atheism" to "Nudist Filmmaking" to "Just Chatting". A writer's group has come out of these meetings. Other regions are encouraging their leadership to participate as a way to better understand what our members want. Our region has better opportunities to work with our members since each of our directors represents a club, but there are the 43% of the direct members that really don't get heard from. The nudists on these calls are passionate about nudism and have many good ideas. I encourage you to take the time and stop by. To get the connection information, send an email to sigs@aanr.com.

During these discussions, sometimes new insights come out. For example, at one point this summer, it became clear that sometimes nudists have trouble revealing that they are nudists because they themselves think being nude is just a little bit naughty. And so they think others might judge them for being nudists. I had never thought of that before. So, if you are afraid to let the world know that you are a nudist, you might examine how you feel about your nudism. Another insight was that perhaps some people are

hesitant to become nudists because they prefer to retain their trappings of success and affluence that clothing give them. Taking off their clothes would make them the same as everyone else.

A Toastmasters club is also being formed. We are still picking the name. In addition to being a fun way to get to know people and hear their stories, Toastmasters is an excellent way to help improve communication and leadership skills. The hope is to encourage leadership growth in AANR. Our next meeting is Wednesday, Oct 5. Again, if you are interested, please email sigs@aanr.com.

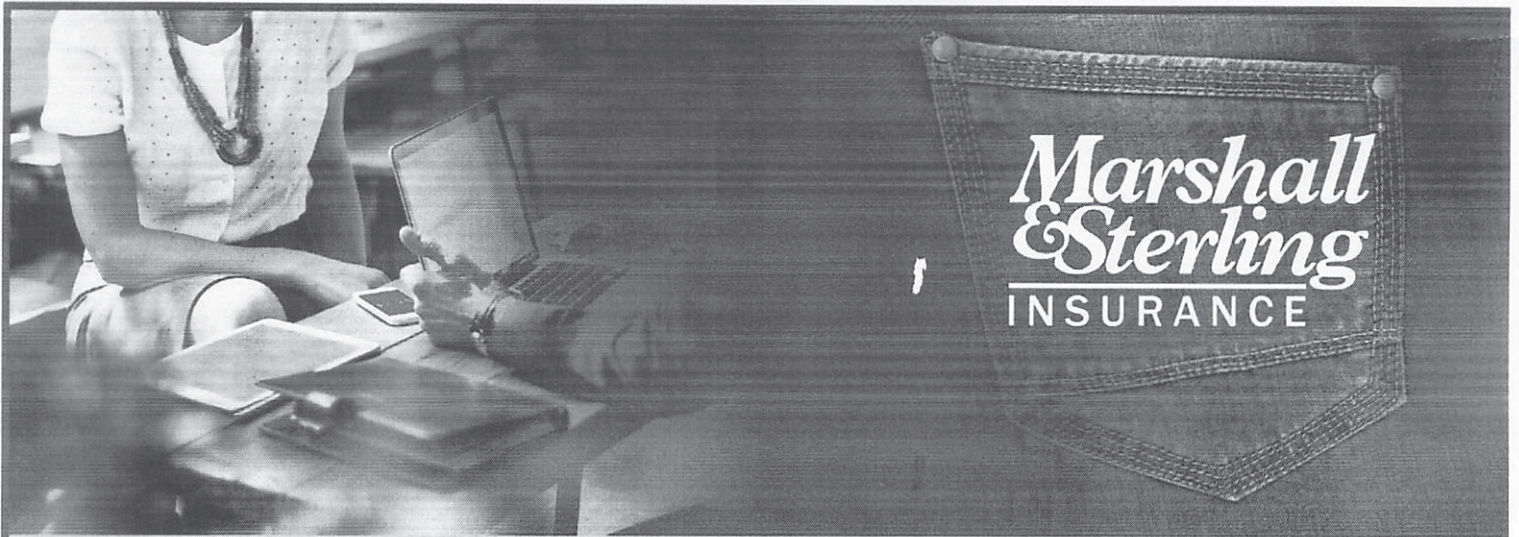

Digital Communications – AANR-NW – Fall Board Meeting 2022

- Our e-news mailing list has 1232 subscribers, up slightly since the spring board meeting. The mailings include a list of the events at clubs around the region for the following month, along with other news items. The items in the event list also include links to the club websites. With fewer events due to the pandemic for the last two years+, we haven't been sending out as many mailings as usual, but we will be returning to a more regular schedule. The open rate (the per cent of mailings being opened by the recipients) is running about 31%, a very high rate in general for bulk mailings. 15% of those who opened it clicked on at least one link and visited one of more external sites; this is an excellent rate, indicating the number of members who are actively reading the mailings and investigating further, including being sent to club web sites.
- The aanr-nw.org calendar is now displayed by default in a more compact collapsed layout. We added events to the calendar. Users can filter by club, by AANR-NW events, by major events and other categories. **Clubs can also add their own events to the calendar, and we can import events directly from some other types of club calendars, and some clubs are doing those things. Please contact us to learn how.**
- At aanr-nw.org, we updated the clubs list page, updated email forwarders for new club presidents and directors as we've been notified, approved and posted photo contest submissions as they came in, and added new posts of NudeScenes and meeting minutes. **The picture gallery support that we use for the photo contests is available for free to all of our hosted websites.**
- The cpanel that is included as part of our hosting package provides a mechanism for editing websites online.
- Eight club websites are being hosted by aanr-nw.org. We handle the domain registration for all of them. We also handle domain registration and email for the Willamettans. We also provide a web site to the AANR Education Foundation. For all of the websites that we host, we also provide up to date SSL certificates (Sites need these for support for secure https pages). Of course, we also host and maintain and produce content for our regional website, aanr-nw.org. Montana Naturists has disbanded but wishes to keep the website for a while in case they can find new leaders. Please let us know if your club would like to take advantage of either free hosting or domain registration service. (dcc@aanr-nw.org)

GAT Fall Board Report 2022

It is important to occasionally remind board and directors, and new individuals involved with AANR and AANR-NW of the role, including their role, in Government Affairs. We have a team across North America to monitor pending legislation that could directly or inadvertently impact social nudism. We have used a program/company called Fiscal Note to identify key words in US and Canadian legislation, such as "nipple", "penis", "sexual", "indecent exposure" and many more. We review these documents out of thousands that are produced, to watch for impact. Many address benign issues such as hunting tags or grease gun parts. But some change access to beaches for nude swimming and sunbathing or broadly state public nudity may be cause to be placed on the NATIONAL SEXUAL PREDATOR REGISTER. Or states will outlaw serving alcohol where someone is naked. The intent may be to limit strip clubs but have obvious impact on nude recreation. This allows us to take appropriate steps to address these consequences before they become law.

Here is where YOU fit in. We cannot be aware of every city council or county action that may be mentioned on local TV or be in local newspapers or even on line. We need to ensure that such actions are brought to our regional GAT representatives to check out and possibly organize tactical action. This has been successful in the Northwest, but I encourage you to remind your club members to be aware, and report, NOT jump and take what could be inappropriate action.

The National Congress of State Legislators was held this year in Denver August 1-3. AANR was out front in our representation as we have been for many years. Our President, Kathy Watzel, joined Eric Schuttauf and others who met with legislators from across the country, who have grown eager to visit our booth and get one of our NCSL Pins. This year it featured a big blue bear which is mascot to the Denver Convention Center and read, "Dare to be Bare". Senators and other legislators have shown they are aware of clubs in their districts and some talk of our long participation as valued parts of their communities.

A related note, AANR Government Affairs is now being supported through the national Wreaths Across America Program. In December, wreaths are placed on graves of fallen veterans. When donations are made through AANR, \$5.00 of each \$15.00 purchase goes to GAT. With each and every \$15 sponsorship, a wreath is placed on the grave of a fallen U.S. veteran. When you donate to WAA your money sponsors a veteran's wreath first, and WAA operates on the small margin remaining.

- \$0.86 of every dollar donated goes toward wreath sponsorships, shipping costs not covered by our trucking partners, sponsorship group paybacks, and other program-related costs.
- Total WAA nationwide staff less than 35 full-time employees. The Executive Director and Chairman of the Board are volunteers.
- National Wreaths Across America Day and other events are made possible by thousands of volunteers who organize local ceremonies, raise funds to sponsor wreaths and participate in the events. Individual wreath sponsors and corporate donors, pay for the majority of the cost for the program and volunteer truck drivers and trucking companies make it possible for WAA to transport wreaths all over the country.
