We are going through all our documents to bring them up to date. The Procedure Manual has had basic terminology updated as allowed. Our Bylaws can only be updated once a year except for spelling, punctuation or as required by AANR. The procedure manual can be updated at any board meeting. The Articles of Incorporation can be updated once a year and is normally only done for address changes. It is important the people look at these items and report needed changes. We will be sending appropriate pages to officers and committee chairs for review

Andee opened the meeting with a look at how we can move AANR into the future. Ideas mainly stemmed around community outreach. Things such as road cleanups, beach cleanups, visible altruism, and promoting the NW clubs working together to promote nudist beliefs.

We are looking at what we can do for direct members. Last year the Nude in the Northwest Campout on the Alvord Desert playa was a success. The planning group for that event is looking at a repeat campout in a new area. Seven direct members went to the Alvord event, and three clubs worked hand in hand to promote it and make it happen. We are going to start looking for a winter event we can make happen. One suggestion was a hotel takeover.

We also want to do a combined event calendar online. It would be a useful tool for clubs to use when planning their events. We know that each club has its events that are “set in stone”, but other events may be able to be scheduled on weekends that could promote other clubs events with less conflicts.

We have discussed the NW NudeScene newsletter that comes out quarterly. The regions NudeScene chair collects information and short news articles from the NW clubs and puts it together in a package that AANR national tends to reformat and possibly make changes that they see fit, and then send out with the Bulletin. The problem is they don’t always get it right and occasionally the intended meaning is lost. Also, we pay a considerable amount of money for this to happen. We are planning 2 more issues of NW NudeScene, as 1 is already in the formatting stage. That change is that after the February issue we will switch to an email-oriented letter with a target of

6 times per year. In this manner, because there will be a shorter lead time, the information will be more relevant. This will still have to be sent to AANR to be emailed, but there should not be a cost to the region.

The question has been brought up about the reading of the dignitaries present list at the beginning of each meeting. There is no direction in our bylaws for this so we will read it as in the past at the general assembly meetings, but only state the names of those present at the board meetings.

We are considering a change to procedure manual 3.01.09 CONVENTION AWARDS COMMITTEE. We would like to remove the statement "All awards are plaques". All directors seem to agree that there isn't enough room at clubs for plaques, and non-landed clubs have no space at all. There will be a motion to remove all awards are plaques from PM 3.01.09, and it will be formally voted on tomorrow at the fall board meeting.

AANR-NW GAT chair Steve Nolen has stated that he could travel to clubs and give a GAT oriented presentation if the clubs could offer some compensation. Also, there is money in the restricted fund that is available for people to attend formal GAT training. Questions about training should be directed to Steve.

There has been discussion about AANR-NW purchasing a mini starlink for use at meetings to increase our zoom capability. Gypsie was looking into cost of equipment and plans, but information was inconclusive.

Summer Lake Hot Springs near Paisley Oregon was given as a possible Nude in the Northwest venue.

Dennis Suarez spoke about the possibility of AANR having a presence at the Northwest Folklife Festival. 2025 will be the 54th annual festival, and in the past, it has attracted 200k+ participants. A booth sponsored by AANR-NW and manned by club volunteers would be a great way to spread the word about AANR, and the northwest clubs.

Karen Lahey spoke about an idea that has been presented by Mark Story of Tiger Mountain. This would be an Operation Handshake event, which would be a joint effort between AANR-NW and TNS.

Tom Rodgers asked if there should be a way to recognize 100% AANR clubs. Ideas range from flags and certificates that could be displayed at landed clubs, to AANR website noting the clubs that are 100%. Discussion came up about what they would do with clubs that claim to be 100% but allow their AANR memberships to lapse. This should not be a short-range issue with the NW clubs, only if the clubs renew memberships without renewing AANR.

The Willamettans will have a presence on the 2025 Bare Necessities Nude Cruise. They will have a booth to promote both their club and AANR-NW.

The Willamettans are considering applying to host the 2026 AANR Convention. They would appreciate NW club support if they are selected.

Rules of Business for Hybrid On-Site and On-Line Meetings for the AANR-NW Region

“Where there is radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views, gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal.”

Henry Robert, *Parliamentary Law*

The business meeting will be recorded. This meeting is being run as a hybrid meeting, with some members at a meeting site and others by video conference. These rules are slightly modified to accommodate this format.

MOTION PROCEDURES:

Motions are to be written and e-mailed or presented on-site to the president and to the secretary, and the secretary will transcribe the e-mailed motions to an AANR-NW Motion Form. One person needs to make the motion and one needs to second unless put forth by a committee. Whenever possible, the motion will be shown to the on-line board members via camera, scan or program.

When a motion is up for discussion:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can “move the previous question” which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable and requires a 2/3rds vote to adopt.

New Business

Stephane Deschenes mentioned that Bare Oaks Family Naturist Park was attacked because they allowed children to attend. Listening to the reports he doesn't see that topic being addressed and believes that AANR should. Nudism at its core is family oriented but we cannot be family oriented if we exclude children. AANR needs to make available the data and material that proves there is no harm in nudism for children so others can address it when needed.

Heather Cheney mentioned that she has seen a shift away from families at some clubs. Many parents have stopped taking their kids to resorts because they don't feel welcome. She also mentioned that some parents are nudists, but they are afraid to raise their kids as nudists.

Ronna Krozy explained that at Solair they welcome children.

Ralph Collinson thought there were two issues. Heather's was an internal one, clubs not welcoming children. The second, the one Stephane spoke about is an external one.

Jon M. from Phoenix stated that he felt that adults are not welcoming children due to their fear of legal repercussions.

Timothy Sargent agreed that the fear of legal repercussions is valid, so AANR needs to work to change the perception.

Dan Hawkins mentioned that he spoke with the COO of Oak Lake Trails and the reason to change to an adult only resort is because when he tells people what he does they are interested until he mentions children and feels that many adults won't attend a nude resort due to that fact. The solution is not to change our policies and eliminate children but rather to educate the public.

Margie Cantlon mentioned that at her club they did not want to go to an adults only club because it might be perceived as a sex club.

Arlette Lowery mentioned that Dan and Stephane are saying the same thing. The problem is that some are not prepared to address the situation.

Joe Rives mentioned that in Puerto Rico you can be nude at the beach because the land is owned by the people. A woman went to a beach and was upset, so worked with a legislator to introduce bills to equate nudity with lewd behavior.

Cyndi Tendick has heard over time "The Official (fill in the blank with podcast, airline etc.)". She is not sure it's proper to pass these titles out. It stifles competition. For instance there are several nudist podcasts and to give one the "official" leave out the others.

Cyndi Tendick also made the comment that as chairs move forward, please consult their regions liaisons. A club doesn't need 6 people telling them different things.

Bob Dixon asked if this was from the current finance committee. Kathy said yes. Bob assumed the \$20,000 per year represented positive impact. Kathy said yes. Bob asked if there was a plan as to when the next increase is coming around.

Kathy Watzel explained that the last increase was in 2019 and was a big jump. Kathy wanted to get away from a big jump every year. Inflation over the last 5 years was 10.6% which would have been an increase of \$10.36 US, if keeping up with inflation. This motion will increase dues by \$1 per year every year. This could be dropped in the future if membership increases enough.

Bob Dixon stated this motion is a surprise to him and he can't support it today but may change his mind after more discussion.

David Levine questioned if this was from the finance committee. He stated he was on the committee both last year and this year and this is the first time he's heard of this.

David Levine also stated he agreed with the motion but not the timing. AANR's reputation on social media and elsewhere is not that good right now and even though this increase is only a dollar people will say why are the dues increasing when AANR is not doing anything. He recommended that the motion be changed to begin in 2026 which will give AANR 18 months to improve its reputation.

Kathy Watzel stated that waiting would put AANR out of touch for 7 years. Ronna Krozy asked if there was any discussion on the INF add on. Kathy Watzel said no.

Ted Peck disagreed with David's assessment and said the AANR is doing a boat load of stuff that he sent to his 29 members, but people don't know it. David responded that Ted is correct, we are doing a lot, and his 29 members know that but the other 40,000 don't.

Margie Cantlon is uncomfortable with the perpetuity of the motion. Said it may be more work for the committee to review dues every year, but she would prefer that to having to consider repealing the motion at a later date.

Sandra Cordell asked when a decision on the INF proposal would be made as that increase would affect this motion. Linda responded that the INF option is a different item and not part of this motion.

Stephane Deschenes mentioned that the October convention is when the new by-laws are being presented and the INF membership question is one of those by-laws.

Joe Rives mentioned that the Florida region has considered a fee increase but has refrained until there is more value to the member.

Kathy stated that if the Florida region raised its dues \$2 then AANR would lose \$23,000 in income. Joe reiterated that all he was saying is that the board couldn't justify a 1-to-5-dollar increase.

Ralph Collinson can't support this motion for the reason Joe Rives stated. Linda Weber called for the vote.

Art Vernon received a charter of a provisional club, Bare Long Island.

Ted Peck suggested a mission statement for AANR. Encouraged the AANR board to revisit John Carver.

Nudist Clubhouse was relaunched.

Art Vernon responded to Ted Peck's comment saying he hasn't read John Carver but did read two other textbooks on non-profit marketing in the 1990s. There is a difference between cause advocacy and business advocacy. Business advocacy has a bottom line which can be measured but cause advocacy is very hard to measure. Believes that every successful business has the attitude that the world is divided into 2 groups. Those who are members and

those who are not yet members. If we believe that social nudity is good, then that's the passion we have to bring. He recognizes all the issues of the environment in which we are operating but those are only challenges or opportunities, not problems. He believes that most people are not either for or against social nudity, which is good as we can talk to those people. We need to figure out how to approach those people.

Joe Rives worked in strategic planning and encouraged the board to set some key performance indicators at the macro level. Two ideas are to set a goal for new members and retention of members.

Linda Weber read the following statement:

President's Speech for the AANR Convention – Shangri-La Ranch – 8/16/24

The American Association for Nude Recreation (AANR) has enjoyed a rich and storied history over its 93 years. As the premier nudist organization, we have often rested on our laurels, preferring the comfort of familiarity over the challenge of progress. However, the world has changed in ways we never imagined, presenting new challenges and ways of doing business.

The Trustees are charged with acting in the best interests of the members and the organization. The Board presents ideas and ensures that we remember our fiduciary duty to use member dues responsibly.

The Regional Boards serve as our “boots on the ground,” working closely with the clubs and members in their regions. They are the first line of contact and work diligently for the members.

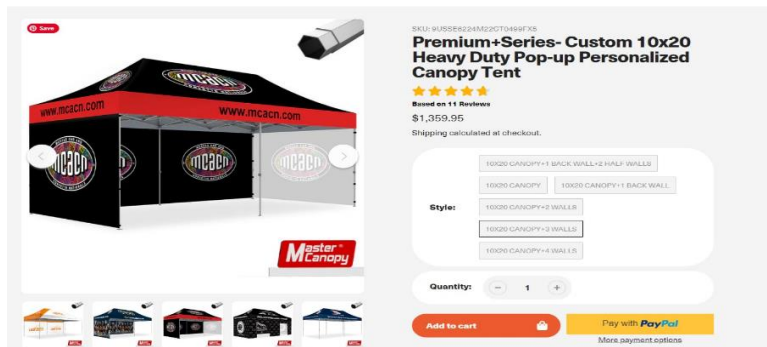

Digital Communications – AANR-NW – Fall Board Meeting 2024

The service where we are hosting our websites stopped providing free backup and restore to us last year (without notice to us). **So, to protect your website, we have found a WordPress plugin that can be installed that can be set up to automate website backups.** It is highly rated. However, we have not yet had to use it to restore. It doesn't backup mail or forwarders. We are still looking for a good way to backup mail and other configurations. More information will be coming. The name of the plugin is “UpdraftPlus - Backup/Restore”. We have set it up to back up to a google drive every day, saving 2 copies. **If you give us an admin user to your WordPress site, we will set it up for you. Otherwise, you will need to do it, or something similar, for your site. At least keep a copy of your website on your local computer.**

Our e-news mailing list currently has 1221 subscribers. The mailings include a list of the events at clubs around the region for the following months, along with other news items. The items in the event list also include links to the club websites. Our last mailing was in August, with events listed through early October and articles about the major events in that period. For our last mailing, the open rate (the per cent of mailings being opened by the recipients) was 42%, a very high rate in general for bulk mailings and perhaps our highest ever. 18 different links were clicked on with a total of 142 clicks, by over 10% of the readers who opened it; this is an excellent rate, indicating the number of members who are actively reading the mailings and investigating further, including being sent to club web sites.

The aanr-nw.org calendar is now displayed by default in a more compact collapsed layout. We added events to the calendar. Users can filter by club, by AANR-NW events, by major events and other categories. **Clubs can also add their own events to the calendar, and we can import events directly from some other types of club calendars, and some clubs are doing those things. Please contact us to learn how.**

At aanr-nw.org, we updated email forwarders for new club presidents and directors and regional officers, approved and posted photo contest submissions as they came in, and added new posts of NudeScenes and meeting minutes. The photo contest pictures were judged at the convention at the Willamettans. There were 340 photos entered. **The picture gallery support that we use for the photo contests is available for free to all of our hosted websites.**

The cpanel that is included as part of our hosting package provides a mechanism for editing websites online.

Nine club websites are being hosted by aanr-nw.org, including one that has been added in the last year, Tiger Mountain Park. We handle the domain registration for all of them. We also handle domain registration and email for the Willamettans. We also provide a web site to the AANR Education Foundation. For all of the websites that we host, we also provide up to date SSL certificates (Sites need these for support for secure https pages). Of course, we also host and maintain and produce content for our regional website, aanr-nw.org. Montana Naturists has disbanded but wishes to keep the website for a while in case they can find new leaders. Please let us know if your club would like to take advantage of either free hosting or domain registration service. (dcc@aanr-nw.org)

Highlights

It's been a quiet summer for the AANR-NW Government Affairs Team, as legislatures are in recess, and we await the outcome of the November elections.

You may know that our AANR-Northwest GAT team was honored at the AANR Convention with the Government Affairs Team Award for our Denny Blaine Nude Beach effort to generate opposition to a proposed project in Seattle that would have jeopardized nude use at an unofficial nude beach on Lake Washington.

Coordinating with a Capitol Hill-based LGBTQ+ grassroots team, our team engaged with AANR to rally opposition by our members. We asked them to answer surveys, write emails and consider attending a public hearing. As hoped, the City promptly cancelled the play area following the jam-packed meeting. At this date the Seattle Parks Department has made a proposal to give the nude use official designation along with personal conduct rules. (See link below.)

This is just one example of how the NW Government Affairs team is working to protect the rights of all nudists, as it has in various iterations for decades. I am especially proud of the excellent work by the team this last couple years and thankful for the support and resources of AANR.

AANR-NW President Andee Rogers has asked me to continue as GAT Chair, and I have agreed to do so. One of my duties, as I see it, is to prepare for new leadership at the end of my term as Chair. As of now, I anticipate serving two more years, with a goal of identifying the next GAT chair and a making a seamless transition in leadership in the summer or fall of 2026.

Please Consider Joining the Team

The AANR-NW team is actively recruiting members who would like to get involved in government affairs at any level from monitoring issues to active lobbying. We typically meet by video monthly on the first Tuesday at 7:15 p.m. Pacific time. We urge each club to designate a person to attend the Zoom sessions and communicate with their members about government affairs concerns.

Recap of major late 2023-24 Issues (previously reported at Convention)

Denny Blaine Nude Beach – In November, we scrambled a team in Seattle and worked with AANR staff to try to dissuade the City of Seattle Parks Department from building a children's play area at Denny Blaine Park, a small traditionally clothing-optional beach on Lake Washington. Our project team formed to include myself, Karen and Jim Lahey, Donna Jennings, Mark Story, Kathy Blanchard, Tim Mullins, Eric Schuttauf, and Carolyn Hawkins from AANR. That group quickly formulated and executed an information campaign to target Seattle and Northwest AANR members with requests to oppose the project by writing emails, signing a petition and attending a public meeting for the event. Jim Lahey, among other AANR members, attended and testified at the standing-room meeting. As a result of heavy opposition, the City promptly canceled the project.

AANR-NW Government Affairs Team (GAT) Report October 2024 Fall Meeting

The parks department recently proposed making Denny Blaine Park an official nude beach. To my knowledge, it will be the first public park in Washington officially designated for nudity. Along with the designation the City promised better enforcement of park behavior rules and firm boundaries for the nude use. [Proposed Supplemental Use Guidelines for Denny Blaine Park](#).

2024 Legislative Highlights

The 2024 legislative season produced few bills, in comparison with 2023. In even numbered years, many legislatures have abbreviated sessions. Montana convenes only in odd numbered years.

The Good

Repeal of Washington's ban on consideration of nudity in reviewing liquor licenses was included in **SB 6105**, which was adopted by the Washington Legislature. This may have opened the way for more businesses to allow nude entertainers and participants on site, without jeopardizing their liquor licenses. It also may open the way for landed clubs to obtain liquor licenses.

Mike Parker monitored and submitted comments in support of **Oregon SB 1576**, which was adopted to restore "recreational immunity" to many public lands. The new law was widely supported by public agencies and others who provide land for trails and recreation in the state. This law was needed to respond to a court decision that increased the risk for agencies for allowing recreational access.

The Bad

The most significant negative bill adopted is **Idaho House Bill 710** (2024), which is a reworked version of a 2023 bill restricting minors' access to materials considered "harmful to minors" in libraries and schools. It creates a cause of action if libraries fail to remove challenged materials deemed prohibited under the act. It was adopted as an emergency and is scheduled to go into effect July 1, 2024.

AANR-NW Directors have allocated \$2,000 to AANR-GAT from its legal fund for professional lobbying to oppose anti-nudity legislation in Wisconsin and Hawaii.

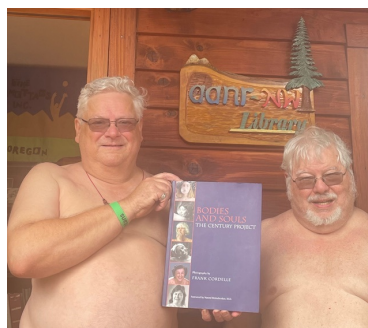

AANR-NW Historians Report

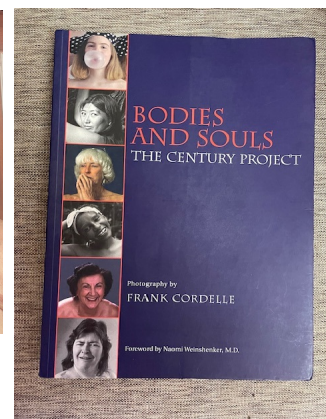
