Overview

This consolidated record of the AANR Northwest Fall Board Meeting Saturday Discussion (created on 2025-10-04 10:01:15) brings together discussions across hosting responsibilities and compensation, logistics and Zoom/Discord capabilities, regional finances, communication and transcription tools, support for clubs and publicity initiatives, event directories and scheduling, camping contingencies, video promotion strategy, payment card options, and operational announcements. Key decisions are pending votes scheduled for 2025-10-05. The content reflects contributions from multiple participants, with remote input from members such as Kane in Alaska, acknowledgments to hosts and contributors, and coordination for upcoming motions, events, and media projects.

Hosting and Compensation

- Host Club Compensation Proposal
 - Increase compensation for hosting a board meeting from \$800 to \$1,000 and for hosting a convention from \$2,500 to \$3,000 due to higher costs.
 - This region may be one of the only ones that compensates host clubs; national conventions cover accommodations and food but do not provide additional compensation.
 - A formal vote will occur tomorrow.
- Hosting Responsibilities and Cost Structure
 - To host a board meeting, clubs must provide accommodations and submit an application detailing what will be supplied; there is no contract, but an application outlining requirements.

Gate fees are waived for specific attendees: board directors, chairpersons, delegates, and their spouses for board meetings; clubs may choose whether to waive fees for others attending the meeting.

- Meals must be offered (for purchase): Friday dinner; Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner; Sunday breakfast and lunch. Copious amounts of coffee should be available.
- Lodging is not free; only grounds fees are waived. Food is not free; it must be offered but is chargeable.
- Clubs typically provide entertainment (e.g., games, karaoke, DJ) and a reception to welcome attendees and engage with club members.
- Hosting Board Meetings: Stipends, Eligibility, and Logistics
 - Current participating clubs include SMR, Kaniksu Ranch and the Willamettans; potential future hosts mentioned were Mountaindale Sun Resort, Tiger Mountain, and Lake Bronson (after convention next year).
 - Non-landed clubs can host board meetings if they can provide meals and lodging options (e.g., motel). Examples cited: Sun Meadow Sun Seekers, Slugs, Hidden Springs.
 - Emphasis on waiving day fees to encourage attendance and support hosting clubs; attendees may opt out of provided meals to save costs, though supporting club-provided meals is preferred.

Meeting Logistics and Platforms

- Meeting Logistics and Zoom Capability
 - Internet capability is required to enable Zoom participation; if internet fails, the meeting will proceed with in-room attendees.
 - Remote participation includes members like Kane in Alaska; Zoom support is considered part of hosting requirements.
- Communication Platforms
 - Considering obtaining a Zoom account or adopting Discord as a free alternative.
 - Discord benefits: multiple groups (e.g., board, directors), chat and video capabilities, and cost savings of several hundred dollars annually.
 - Plan to send Discord invitations within the next three months, test group chats, and evaluate feasibility with Kane's guidance; tutorials are available.

Finances and Tools

- Regional Finances and Budget Considerations
 - The region has money in the bank; some budget lines are under-spent, and overall they are close compared to other years. Funds are available.
- Meeting Recording and Transcription Tool
 -

The secretary uses PlaudNote, an AI digital recorder providing transcripts, summary outlines, and flags items it perceives as unresolved.

- Costs: device purchase at 159; subscription for 1,200 minutes/month was supposed to be 150 a year, but we are being billed for \$89 a year. The time is sufficient for board meetings and conventions.
- A proposal was made to compensate Robby for purchasing the recorder; participants affirmed its usefulness.
- Payment Card for Operational Expenses
 - Preference for a credit card to handle recurring online bills (e.g., Microsoft Word for the legislation committee, library protections) and avoid mailing checks; treasurer would hold the card for board-approved purchases.
 - Challenges: institutions may require a personal name tied to the card; rotating officers complicate accountability.
 - Examples: KeyBank issued multiple cards under the business name with individual names; balances paid monthly; treasurer responsible and can transfer when roles change. Another group relied on an old card in someone else's name for 8 years.
 - Alternative: a prepaid card charged via a two-signature voucher for "\$1,000," reloaded as needed, to manage purchases and subscriptions without an open credit line.

Acknowledgments and Roles

- Appreciation to Willamettans for hosting and to Gypsie for diligent budget tracking.
- Kyle was thanked for setup efforts. Gypsie's budgeting work was specifically called out as accurate and quiet diligent.
- Committee Reports (Preview)
 - Kane was requested to speak about the "My Nude Story" and provide a YADAC committee report, either today or tomorrow.

Club Support and Publicity

- Support for Struggling Non-Landed Clubs
 - Rogue Suncatchers gained two new members (~40 years old) and seek help with background checks; suggestions were made for larger landed clubs to assist due to having unused background check subscription capacity.

- Plan to use email blasts via the main office to promote events to AANR members within a 200-mile radius of a club's area to attract attendance and membership.
- AANR's website now lists all non-landed clubs to showcase activity options (e.g., blueberry picking, kayak trips) and broaden visibility.
- "My Nude Story" and Social Media Promotion
 - Collaboration to submit 1–2 minute videos via AANR's website; team (including Kane, Linda, Evan, and YADAC members) quality-checks before sharing on AANR accounts.
 - Current participation around 12; initiative is new and aims for growth.
 - Encouragement for directors and presidents to create and promote videos; printed guidance distributed; more tutorials available.
- Additional ideas: short advertising reels highlighting amenities (e.g., docks, sauna, hot tubs, pool) on Instagram, Facebook, TikTok, YouTube Shorts. ■ Effective strategy requires proficiency and consistent posting (e.g., every other day); resource commitment is needed.
- Content Generation and Submissions
 - Submit news reels to Jeff via the provided email for national-scale publishing; Jeff is available for questions by email or phone.
 - Goal: build visibility and provide supportive materials clubs can use for outreach.
- Media, Press, and Larger Publication Outreach
 - Favorable feature article covered nudist opportunities and venues; a reporter spent three hours onsite, interviewed people, and asked open questions; sensitive topics redirected to avoid issues.
 - Contact local newspapers directly for coverage; need a standardized introductory paragraph describing who the clubs are and what they represent.
 - Larger publications (e.g., Oregonian) can be leveraged for articles like "where to be nude in Oregon."
 - Mary Jane holds press contacts and can provide lists for statewide or regional distribution; serves as a consultant after past PR firm contracts of \$80,000–\$100,000 per year.
 - Historical resources exist on press releases and public speaking; interest in scanning and reusing materials, including guidance for radio/podcast engagement and tracking supportive media contacts.

Community Activities and WINR

- Community Presence and Local Activities
 - Chamber of Commerce membership and participation can put clubs on the local map.
 - “Community crawl” events visiting local businesses create friendly visibility; notify restaurants in advance with headcount.
 - Traditions:
 - December board meeting tip tradition: participants bring \$100, enjoy breakfast, and leave the entire \$100 as a tip; one instance had 31 participants; call ahead for tipping policy.
 - Ongoing restaurant relationships (e.g., Wednesday “Joker night”) fosters goodwill; owners comp gift certificates for club events.
 - Christmas light parade with sleigh float, music, Santa, and canned food donations; well-received by families.
- WINR Promotion and Materials
 - WINR is growing nationwide with about 20 women engaged; Women of the West developed a 4x3 banner for Shangri-La’s pool and plan distribution across western clubs; clubs can add local WINR contact info.
 - The WOW campaign and WINR calendars have increased WINR visibility; calendars for next year are available.
- WINR Calendars and Education Foundation Support
 - Calendars cost \$20; clubs can take quantities (e.g., 5 requested by Mountaindale) to sell, including on consignment if needed.
 - Proceeds, after recouping costs, typically contribute around three or four thousand dollars to the Education Foundation.
 - Payment options include QR code, PayPal, Square, and cash; no shipping when purchased onsite.

Directories, Scheduling, and Events

- Website Hosting Transition and Email Forwarding
 - Clubs are moving away from Northwest-hosted websites to free Google services; presidents of landed clubs are pursuing their own sites.
 - The only paid item going forward will be the Northwest website. Current email forwarding is unreliable; Jim has identified a new forwarding solution and will present details when more people are online, possibly tomorrow.

- Update from the last meeting; progress ongoing with Karen assisting non landed clubs.
- Regional Events Directory and Scheduling Coordination
 - Build a comprehensive directory of all club events to reduce major conflicts, acknowledging summer's short season may limit complete avoidance.
 - Brett is compiling submissions; clubs should send yearly schedules. Jim will also collect schedules for "the nudescene" to list events without scraping each website.
 - Approach: two lists—major signature events (e.g., Music Fest, Western Days) and minor events (e.g., Cabin Crawls)—to avoid overlap and ensure visibility of key activities.
Examples of contributors: Lake Bronson and the Willamettans have year-long sheets ready.
- Scheduling Meetings and Dates
 - Springboard meeting planned; calendar coordination needed. Suggested timing is the second week because the first week is Easter.
 - A date range mentioned: April 10-12.

Alvord Desert and Winter Warm-Up Planning

- "Nude in the Northwest" at Alvord Desert
 - Planned for the third weekend in June, with Lake Bronson blocking that weekend; event is weather-dependent.
 - Last year's event was canceled due to rain; seeking to avoid Burning Man-style weather issues.
 - Backup sites: alternative BLM locations in central/southern Oregon exist but would be more restricted than Alvord.
- Winter Warm-Up Off-Site Gathering
 - Concept: rent a large venue (e.g., Airbnb, castle in Arlington, college dorm in Idaho) for 25–30 people; include outings like hot springs or a nude bowling event in Shoreline near Seattle.
 - Venue search challenges: hotels with on-site restaurants won't close to the public; requirements limit options. Lowering expectations (e.g., Airbnb-style venues) may improve feasibility.
 - Coordination on Discord; participants include Bunny, Jenny, , and Kane; goal is a non-club-specific event to include direct members and foster togetherness.
- Camping Contingency Planning and Nudity Considerations
 - Alternatives include BLM land near Brothers and the Alvord hot springs RV campground, with large parking areas off the playa.

- Concerns about nudity permissibility at the campground due to proximity to public areas; emphasis on respectful behavior.
- BLM “mini playa” spots of a couple acres require staying within the area and avoiding public roads while nude.
- Weather-triggered redirection: if desert conditions turn bad, attendees could redirect to Alvord as a backup.
- Reservation policies are unclear; confirmation is needed on whether the campground takes reservations.

Video Strategy and Operations

- AANR Introductory Video
 - A two-minute video explaining AANR’s value for offices, reception areas, websites, and potential looping; targets guests already interested in nudity, highlighting benefits of AANR membership with a QR code.
 - Feedback requested to scrutinize content; project in Canva; participants can be added for review.
- Promotional Video Review and Improvements
 - Previewed regional video for office reception and potential national use; to be sent to Nilda and Kane for comments; verify photo permissions for contributors.
 - Suggestions: slow slide pacing (around 30 seconds where needed), extend to ~3 minutes, serve as a teaser prompting QR code scans.
 - Enhancements: clear final “Join today” call to action with QR code; consider a static QR code in a corner throughout; ensure final image persists without whiteout/fadeaway.
 - Make national version generic with optional northwest segment; increase diversity in photos from archives and ANR materials.

Operations, Announcements, and Member Services

- Event Logistics and Announcements
 - Photo booth setup: Dawn at the Craft Shack at 7:30 for costume and general photos.
 - Dance and practice sessions: dance tonight in “dark beer” (context unclear); polka practice dance at 1 today in the meeting space; meeting finished early to accommodate.
 - Library open house: 1 to 3 tomorrow after meetings and lunch; videos, magazines, books, and historical materials on display.

- Video display plan: video will scroll at the lodge reception at 3; timing adjusted and kept running during office hours.
- Member Reimbursements and Sign-Ins
 - Directors/chairs/board members can claim up to \$100 for attending meetings, subject to a \$1,000 budget cap; if more than 10 apply, reimbursements will be less than \$100.
 - Kinetic sign-in and AANR sign-in sheets available; clubs encouraged to post them to reconnect members after issues with the new system.
 - A PDF of sign-in materials can be sent for club newsletters or email blasts.
 - Photo permissions: a photo release is available; those who do not want their picture posted should indicate so.

Open Issues & Risks

- Hosting and Compensation
 - Final decision on stipend and convention support increases is pending a vote tomorrow.
- Platforms and Communication
 - Whether the Northwest will adopt Discord instead of a paid Zoom account remains to be tested and decided.
- Club Support and Media
 - Specific club/person to assist Rogue Suncatchers with background checks has not been identified.
 - Standardized introductory text for press outreach is not finalized; consolidation of guidance and vetted contact lists is needed.
- Video Readiness
 - Slide pacing, QR code implementation, and permissions require confirmation.
- Directories and Scheduling
 - Email forwarding transition details and timing for the new solution are not yet finalized.
 - Event directory completeness depends on clubs submitting schedules; summer conflicts may persist.
 - Springboard meeting date needs confirmation within April 10-12 (second week due to Easter).
- Alvord and Winter Warm-Up
 - Weather risk for Alvord Desert; last year's cancellation underscores contingency needs.
 - Backup BLM venues are more restricted, selection unresolved.
 - Winter warm-up venue feasibility depends on lowered expectations and securing an appropriate property.
- Operations and Member Engagement
 - Reconnecting members via the new system relies on clubs implementing sign ins and distributing PDFs effectively.

- Payment Card Responsibilities
 - Banks may require a personal name on the card, creating accountability risks with rotating officers; no final decision on card type or issuing bank.

Rules of Business for Hybrid On-Site and On-Line Meetings for the AANR-NW Region

“Where there is radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views, gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal.”

Henry Robert, *Parliamentary Law*

The business meeting will be recorded. This meeting is being run as a hybrid meeting, with some members at a meeting site and others by video conference. These rules are slightly modified to accommodate this format.

MOTION PROCEDURES:

Motions are to be written and e-mailed or presented on-site to the president and to the secretary, and the secretary will transcribe the e-mailed motions to an AANR-NW Motion Form. One person needs to make the motion and one needs to second unless put forth by a committee. Whenever possible, the motion will be shown to the on-line board members via camera, scan or program.

When a motion is up for discussion:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can “move the previous question” which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable and requires a 2/3rds vote to adopt.

To spark curiosity, Lake Bronson has already shared a clever introduction video of their beautiful grounds, paired with a postcard featuring a QR code link to the video. What a fun way to spread the word and build anticipation!

One thing is certain: you will *not* want to miss this convention. Mark your calendars, pack your bags, and get ready to be surprised—we'll see you at Lake Bronson in 2026!

Digital Communications – AANR-NW – Fall Board Meeting 2025

Two years ago, we moved where we hosted our websites in order to provide better mail service to our clubs. We moved to a company (Hostgator) that had been around a long time (2002) and provided the services that we needed. They host over 8 million websites. Since then, they have been sold and have stopped providing some of the services that we depend on (such as automatic backup). They no longer offer the type of hosting that we are using. So when we call for support, it is spotty at best.

We are good through the middle of next March, 2026. The renewal price would go up considerably come March, to \$77/month or \$88/month depending on length of service we sign up for. We will need to change. This will be a huge amount of work. We're letting everyone know now. We won't wait until the last moment. We started looking around in February and reported this to the clubs, then to the board in the spring 2025 report and meeting. Reseller hosting (what we need) seems to be less available than it has been in the past, so the board decided in spring to end the service by March. To assist clubs in migrating from the shared AANR-NW server, we have been creating small websites for the smaller clubs using Google Sites. So far, we have established sites for SLUGS, Rogue SunCatchers, Sun Meadow Sun Catchers, and Columbia River Sun Club. If anyone has any recommendations or questions, please let us know.

The aanr-nw.org calendar is now displayed by default in a more compact collapsed layout. We added events to the calendar. Users can filter by club, by AANR-NW events, by major events and other categories. **Clubs can also add their own events to the calendar, and we can import events directly from some other types of club calendars, and some clubs are doing those things. Please contact us to learn how.**

At aanr-nw.org, we updated email forwarders for new club presidents and directors and added new posts of NudeScenes and meeting minutes.

The cpanel that is included as part of our hosting package provides a mechanism for editing websites online.

Five club websites have been using hosting provided by aanr-nw.org. We handle the domain registration for all of them. We also handle domain registration and email for the Willamettans. We also provide a web site to the AANR Education Foundation. Four others are no longer hosted, because we helped them move to a new server, as described above. For all of the websites that we host, we also provide up to date SSL certificates (Sites need these for support for secure https pages). Of course, we also host and maintain and produce content for our regional website, aanr-nw.org. Montana Naturists has disbanded but wishes to keep the website for a while in case they can find new leaders. Once we shut down the club hosting provided by the region, we will still be providing the domain registration and other services as needed, and we will be maintaining the regional site. Please let us know if your club has any questions or needs assistance. (dcc@aanr-nw.org)

At the fall 2024 board and budget meeting, we agreed to do the February issue in print and announce a plan then to switch to an electronic version after that. That allows a much shorter lead time, eliminates the printing and mailing costs, and makes the size and content more flexible. Since then, I published an extra issue in April, as sort of a test, then issues in May, July and September. It was suggested to try to do five issues a year, every two months in the summer and every three months for some part of the off-season. I'm going to do a November issue this year, because I want to do a January issue, since some clubs plan their annual schedule in December. Last year, the January calendar was listed in the November issue, and it only contained one January 1 event, one event TBD and three events from my clubs. I suggest a schedule for next year and beyond of January, March, May, July, and October. At the meeting we can discuss how this has worked out so far and how we will continue. I think it has been going well, except that a lot of members still aren't getting it, including me, since we need to ask AANR to send these using their email list. You should tell your members that if they are not receiving these, they should call the AANR office at 1-800-try-nude before noon Pacific time to ask them for help fixing their account.

Previous NudeScene issues can be found on aanr-nw.org, under "For Members Only", with password "Nud3".

Several clubs have not been sending calendar and club news. I've been reviewing club web sites for the information, but this would be easier and more accurate and engaging if all the club publicists would provide this. Please let me know who your NudeScene contact is, with e-mail address, so I can include them in my reminders.

AANR NW Director of Direct Members and Youth Report

09/10/2025

To help foster a sense of community and self-empowerment for direct members, MyNudeStory was launched that shares the personal stories of individuals through social media. A member can use their phones to record a 1–2-minute video from the chest or neck up about their personal story into social nudism. These videos can then be submitted on AANR's website at <https://www.aanr.com/mynudestory/> to be quality checked and shared through AANR's accounts.

The Non-Landed Startup Guide (a guide to help individuals who feel empowered to start their own naturist group within a step-by-step process) was finished and launched earlier this year. We are now undertaking a video or audio tutorial series that covers some of these same points but also expands on others not included in the Guide, that both non-landed clubs and landed clubs could take advantage of. This helps the viewer to relate to and understand the material a little better when explained by individuals. This is simply another addition for the greater Non-Landed Startup Package that can benefit Northwesterners in areas near or far away from a nudist club.

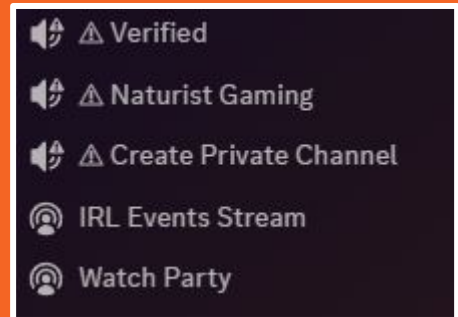
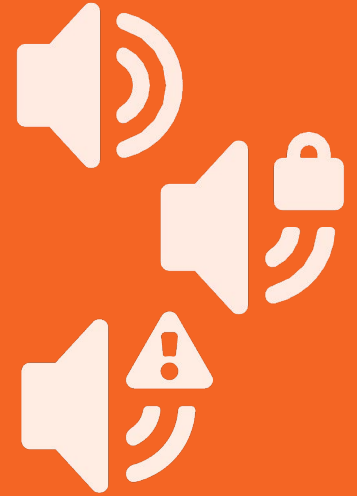
Voice and video are integrated into one and each user can choose to activate their mic and camera on their own.

Everyone is able to speak and share video. There additionally is a "text" chat included with every voice channel.

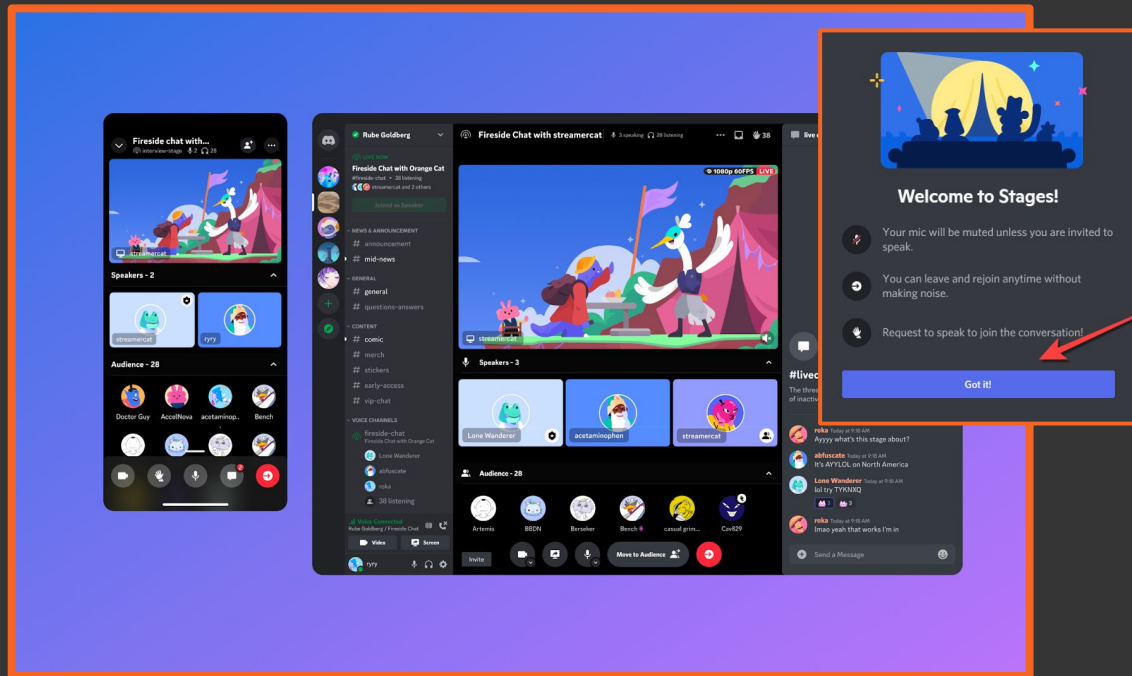
→ Stage Channel

Used for presenters to give a presentation and an audience to tune in and watch. Includes a text channel.



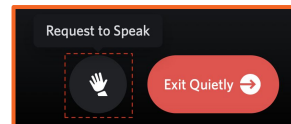
Stage Channels

Discord Stage channels are specialized voice channels for hosting organized live events, such as Q&As, AMAs, panels, podcasts, or performances, where a few speakers can broadcast audio, video, or screen share to a large, listening audience.



Tip

Listeners can raise their hand to request to speak. A moderator can manage giving someone the ability to speak.





Tip

You can adjust role access permission per category or per channel to allow certain roles to have only access to certain channels.

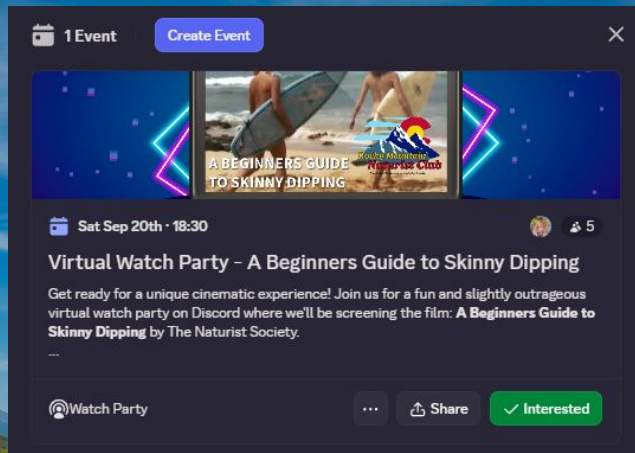
Roles & Permissions

Roles such as Member, Guest, Board Member, Volunteer, etc., help to manage access and keep things safe and organized.

Mirrors how we already manage membership tiers in person.

Connecting Members

- Share updates, photos and ideas year-round.
- Provide a welcoming space for newcomers to ask questions.
- Foster local and regional engagement among members between physical gatherings.
- Connect with remote members who cannot attend in-person events and gatherings.





Tip

Having channels geared toward each club in the region allows members to connect with clubs they don't typically visit or are looking to visit.

Connecting Clubs

Shared channels or joint servers for clubs to coordinate regional retreats, advocacy efforts, or social meetups.

Allow clubs to grow the movement together.

Hosting Events

- Schedule with RSVP's, reminders and use the built-in voice/video chats.
- Simplifies organizing meetings, socials, workshops and webinars.
- Unlike Zoom, Discord requires no extra downloads beyond its own software/app.



Tip

Virtual game nights and events engage members who may not be able to attend in person events.

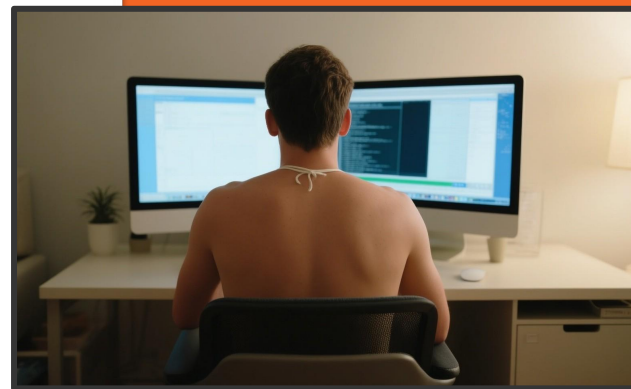
1. Be an active and participating member of the club, meet new people, and have fun!
2. Always be respectful of others and their personal space. Use your "neutral comment" to help us promote an inclusive and family-friendly environment for all our members to enjoy.
3. All nude images should be posted in the appropriate Member Chat. No nudes or sexualized chat in the General Chat area. Appropriate non-sexual nude images may only be posted in the "If A...starts" photo chat.
4. Staring at the body or body parts of other members is creepy. Don't be creepy.
5. No sales, or sales type discussions or links, requests or demands for money or donations, or endorse self or product promotion.
6. Profanity and lewd, sexually suggestive comments are never permitted.
7. Please don't post images of other people outside of your immediate circle (except with their written permission) including posting any kind of porn or sexually explicit content. Only post images of yourself! Any photos posted with other people in them must have a written release for use.
8. No body shaming, nude comments, fights, or sexual orientation shaming - respect everyone! Harassment of any member, even via DM, may result in a ban. Threats of violence, sharing publicly revealing personal info or pics, blackmailing or "outing" and not be tolerated.
9. Content of this server, including chats and posts or photos are not to be distributed and shared with anyone, any other server, or anywhere else. "Stealing" and posting contents of this server will result in immediate lifetime ban. This is not a file to download images to share.
10. Camming the members of this club for the promotion of your business, religion, or sales goals is strictly prohibited. This is a social club for fun and relaxation, not an audience for your cause.
11. When using a video chat channel, you must be on camera. Additionally your camera must be focused on the upper torso only. If your camera is pointed toward your genitals, this is grounds for removal from the group.
12. Always be on your best behavior. Any action of yours that is considered by another member as being sexually suggestive, offensive or unwanted will get you reported and banned from this club. No exceptions!
13. No private 1-on-1 messages of any sort in our chats and videochat channels. This may be grounds for removal from this server.

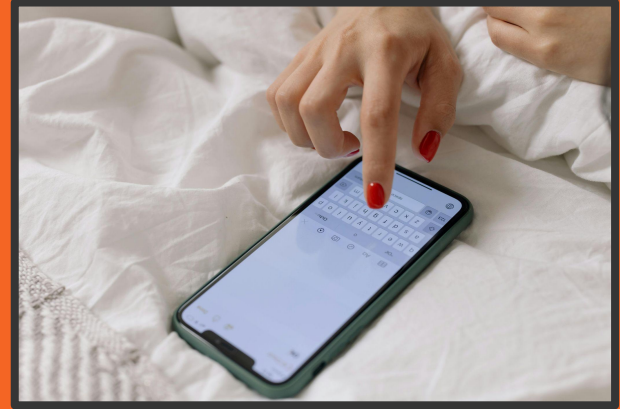

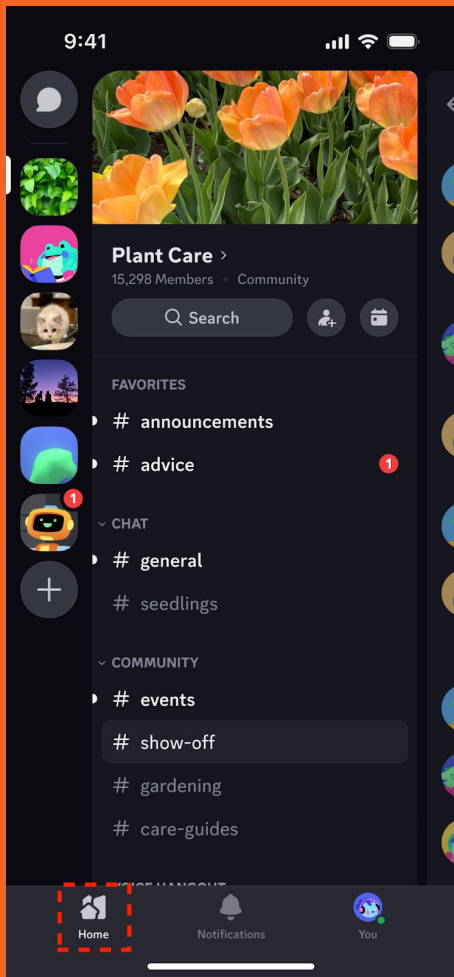

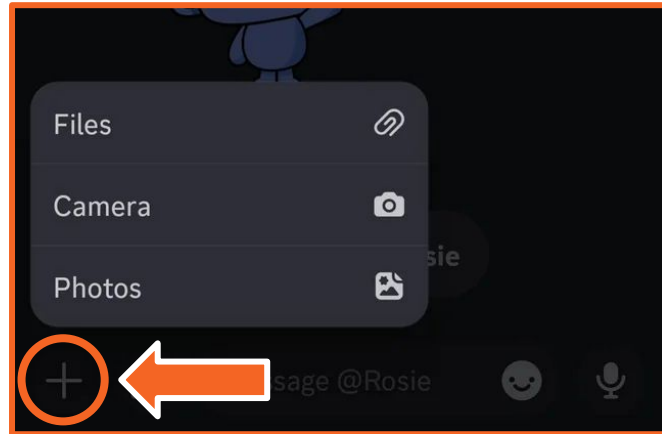

Start small

Add more channels and functions as you continue to grow your digital clubhouse!

Keep it Relevant

Keep your channels straight forward and organized in a way that connects with your members.

Ease Into It

Start by launching your digital clubhouse for just your board or club and expand to include more clubs in your region.

Safety & Security

- There are settings within the software that can be enabled to help prevent “raids” and spamming.
- Use of bots with moderation abilities can fill in the gaps when moderators are not available.
- Safety & security should be a priority for our users.

Apps Permissions

Use External Apps



Allows apps that members have added to their account to post messages. When disabled, the messages will be private.

Recent Attack Lessons Learned

- “Apps” cannot be banned via built in commands or bot commands.
- Limit who can add/use external apps to your server.
