Treasurer – Terri Capshaw
I handed out a balance sheet and Profit & Loss for 2020. We haven't had enough activity to produce a budget to actual for 2021 yet. Our income, primarily dues, only achieved 88% of our objective. With the closing of LARC and the Covid year, that probably wasn't bad. None of the budgeted travel happened except for the president's trip to the AANR mid-winter meeting at the beginning of the year, committee expenses and many other expenses were down. Our actual expenses were about half of the budgeted expense, so our net ordinary income and increase in savings was almost \$10,000.

Member Trustee – Karen Lahey

There was discussion since the AANR mid-winter board meeting about AANR's name, because some people have started to call it AANR International to include Canada, but that isn't the name. It's OK to mention the international headquarters or international convention, but the organization is just AANR. See the written report for other details.

AANR Vice-President – Margie Cantlon
AANR has gone live with Impexium for all associates and for a few clubs so far, including Sun Meadow. It's unbelievably easy to use. It's getting closer to general use.

Committee reports:

Brand Management – Karen Lahey
We discussed advertising to the RV community, so we will pursue that. We didn't hold the photography contest last year but we did get some entries, so those entries will be rolled into this year's contest, and we are accepting further entries via the regional website. The contest judging will be at the convention at the Willamettans. The World Naked bike ride may be cancelled again, so there wouldn't be any branding expenses there, which would free up more budget. With the 75th AANR-NW anniversary and 90th AANRiversary both coming up, the board agreed that spending more on the 75th

anniversary seemed reasonable, since AANR seems a bit slow on coming up with their promotions. Magnets, medallions or patches, chip clips, kitchen tools, grocery bags or other giveaways that would be kept seem best.

2021 Conventions and Facilities – Andee Rodgers

The convention will be at Willamettans on July 16-18. Steve Jones, the committee chair, says that planning is continuing and they have it all under control. Shirley described some of the club updates. Dogs are welcome, and the dog park is now in the area of the old golf course. They have a new stage in the bar area, with new Karaoke equipment. Meal planning is continuing. You can no longer allowed to bring your own alcohol into the bar area, but their rates are very reasonable. The pickle ball courts are in great shape, as is the volleyball. The pool has a new motor and heater. We have sauna, hot tub, bocce ball, horse shoes. New rates are listed on the website. Be sure to visit the AANR-NW library at the Willamettans while you're there. There will be open houses for the library planned. Once all the rooms are booked, there may be cancellations or trailers from residences available. There is a lot of tent and trailer space.

2022 Convention and Facilities – Susan Bale

The convention will be at Sun Meadow. It is planned as a 10 day event, including the Skin to the Wind Festival the previous weekend.

Finance – Nilda Malloy

Since we haven't been able to perform an audit, since this meeting is remote, there will be a motion to present the audit in the fall. If possible, the audit will be performed at or before the convention.

Government affairs – Dave Smith

Joe Haggerty proposes that we try to turn the 455 acre Bowers Rock State Park into a clothing optional park. The park is a remote park on the Willamette River near Albany, OR. Donna sent Shirley and Joe the AANR manual about how to help form a clothing optional park or beach. Mike and Shirley commented that we need to discuss this with the parks department and we need to get nudist users who would advocate and help with keeping the park clean and keep good behavior. Shirley commented that this is a long process and perhaps she and Mike could meet with Joe to start to prepare a plan of action. Mike proposed that Joe should put together an article to put into the enews to call for volunteers to start this.

Hall of Fame – Mike Parker for Pat Brown

The deadline for Hall of Fame and other honor awards is May 1. Please consider nominating someone. Check the list of Hall of Fame members on aanr-nw.org to look for names you think should be honored, but aren't on the list. There are no open

nominations currently. Nominations go to Pat Brown or hall-of-fame@aanr-nw.org. Several people have been added to the committee for judging.

Historian – Mike Parker

See written report and the AANR-NW Library & Archives Action Plan. **LuCinda Gustavson** described that they are refocusing the purpose of the library to concentrate more on AANR-NW. There is an action plan to reorganize the library to be more user friendly with displays and old videos and other physical changes. We are going online as part of the nudist library consortium with the other four nudist libraries in the country. We need a new computer and a scanner designed for magazines and books. We want to have the library open on regular hours. There is a motion coming up in new business to acquire new equipment.

Internal Administration – Jerome Stark

Donna Jennings contacted me on 4/9/21 and let me know that there was a complaint that took place at one of our clubs. As the probationary member did not want to pursue membership it is doubtful this will go any further. Reading through the notes I received, it looks like the complaints were never brought before the board at the club. I want to make a point that the clubs need to stress the importance to their members of bringing potential problems to the board or appropriate committee first. Many items are easily rectified if they become known. Otherwise, it has been quiet.

No new business. I'd like to update our bylaws or procedures about holding on-line meetings when necessary.

Rules of Business for On-Line Meetings for the AANR-NW Region

“Where there is radical difference of opinion in an organization, one side must yield. The great lesson for democracies to learn is for the majority to give the minority a full, free opportunity to present their side of the case, and then for the minority, having failed to win a majority to their views, gracefully to submit and to recognize the action as that of the entire organization, and cheerfully to assist in carrying it out, until they can secure its repeal.”

Henry Robert, *Parliamentary Law*

The business meeting will be recorded. This meeting is being run by video conference, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. These rules are slightly modified to accommodate this format.

MOTION PROCEDURES:

Motions are to be written and e-mailed to the president and to the secretary, and the secretary will transcribe the motion to an AANR-NW Motion Form. One person needs to make the motion and one to second unless put forth by a committee. Whenever possible, the motion will be shown to the board via camera, scan or program.

When a motion is up for discussion:

- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can “move the previous question” which immediately stops debate. The motion needs a second, is not debatable and requires a 2/3rds vote to adopt.

President's Report for the 2021 AANR-NW Spring Board Meeting

The American Association for Nude Recreation will celebrate two milestones this summer. AANR-NW celebrates our 75th Diamond AANR-versary while AANR will celebrate its 90th AANR-versary on July 10, 2021. The Public Relations Committee is excited to reflect on our successes while looking forward to the next 90 years of advances in social nudism. There are some exciting plans to mark the occasion in the coming months, including thoughts for this summer's Regional convention to be held at the Willamettans on July 15 -18, 2021.

The end of the year membership numbers were released by the AANR main office and the NW numbers showed we were down by only 7% at the end of 2020. With clubs reopening this year, we are expecting to regain lost members and gain new members. Of the seven regions which compose AANR, the NW suffered the second lowest loss of members. Well done, clubs!

During the March 6, 2021 GAT meeting it was brought to AANR's attention that the status of Little Makena Nude Beach on Maui is facing changes or permanent shut down. Originally, Pu'u o Lai was closed by the State Parks Service over COVID 19 concerns of lack of mask usage and lack of social distancing. Long term, there are significant indicators that Little Beach will not necessarily return as a nude beach. GAT will be closely monitoring this situation with more details to follow as they emerge.

I currently serve on two AANR ad hoc committees for Public Relations and Membership Management. One is addressing diversity at all AANR clubs and establishing social media guidelines for AANR, the regions and the clubs, regarding what to post online and on websites so that we can maintain a positive message from our members about social nudism in general. Your suggestions on how to achieve this are always welcomed.

The AANR-Florida region is voting on a Non-Discrimination policy based on the one that the NW passed in April 2018! I will keep you posted on how it fares.

There is still time to submit your nominations for your favorite for "Member of the Year" and "Hall of Fame" awards and submit applications for the AANR-NW Scholarship Award.

Lastly, I would like to thank all the NW clubs for their perseverance and patience throughout the last year and for surviving their challenges, fires, closures and revenue deficits. With the advent of the 2021 summer season about to begin, I wish you a fun-filled and prosperous season loaded with new members, new friendships formed and the re-establishment of old friendships. Enjoy your freedom from clothing this year!

Vice President's Report
Spring 2021

I took over our AANR NW media outlets in October, 2020, which included Facebook and Twitter. I began an Instagram account as well. Currently we have 1,341 Facebook members, 3,621 Twitter tweeters, and 913 Instagram followers. I try to post at least once a week. Featuring our NW clubs is a post that will be repeated throughout the year. Since most clubs have been closed due to the pandemic, this has not been at the forefront. Hopefully, that will change very soon. Should you like an event advertised on our media sites, just send me a note about it. I am always happy to feature any event that your club is having. A photo is always helpful to have with the post. Make sure and have a signed photo release for any that you send.

Facebook has been a challenge. Many inappropriate photos and comments were being posted at the beginning of the year. I put out a post stating what the purpose of this group was as well as what is appropriate content. I also decided to create some membership questions to be answered. Some people will not even bother to answer these few questions. I'm okay with that because that tells me they aren't seeking a community to be a part of. The questions are:

What is your main reason for joining our page?

What is your definition of nudism?

What nudist places have you visited so far?

Are you an AANR member?

Will you agree to adhere to the standards set by AANR?

Once questions are answered, I view their profile to further determine their suitability for the group. Most are admitted at this point. I send this notice:

Welcome! You have been approved to join the AANR NW Facebook page.

Please keep in mind that AANR is dedicated to content that fits nudist family values. Any inappropriate content, which is of a sexual nature, will be removed. Should you persist in that type of activity, you will be promptly removed. To view our policies visit our site @ <https://www.aanr-nw.org/> or the national site @ <https://www.aanr.com/about-aanr>

When I find questionable content, I ask more questions via Messenger about why I am hesitant. Those questions often go unanswered. After a week of no response, I decline their request and keep track of who has been contacted, how, and why. I also keep track of who has been declined or removed and the reason. I believe this strategy is helping to weed out those who just want to post photos of a sexual nature or get a peep show. It has also cut down a great deal on inappropriate comments.

A set of rules to be followed in the Facebook group were also added.

Should any of these rules be violated, a member is removed. It can be a time consuming effort, but I am happy to do it.

We have members and followers from all over the world. It is good to see and hear about what other nudist groups are doing in other countries.

Trustee Report

Normally at this time of year, I would be writing about plans for the upcoming year. But to be honest, I have no idea where we will be 6 weeks from now. Things are looking up and it seems like we may be able to start to get back to normal later this summer. The AANR-NW Convention is still planned for mid-July at the Willamettans near Eugene, OR and the AANR Convention is still planned for early August at Star Ranch near Austin, TX. Here's hoping!!

But in the meantime, you may wonder what we trustees work on and worry about. We still keep busy.

For AANR, the committees that I sit on are the Membership Marketing Committee (I am the chair), PR and the 90th AANRversary Committee. For the AANR Education Foundations, I sit on the Scholarship Committee and the Gifts and Grants Committee.

Here's what these committees are involved with.

George Oberle, who sits on the Membership Marketing committee, has graciously volunteered to create a new, modernized website for AANR. As well as making the website easier and more pleasant to use, its framework will allow easier addition of new content with no coding skills necessary. This website 'should' be public by the time that you see this. Once we have this new website, we will constantly want your stories, articles and pictures about Naturism and places in nature you enjoy being nude . . . If you read the bulletin you will see that much of its content originates in the Northwest. We can continue to contribute to AANR by also contributing content to the new website. George's AANR friendly, invite only, Naturist Social Media Community www.NaturistHub.com will be also be incorporated into the site for AANR Members to connect online where #NoPorn and #NoHate is the policy. NaturistHub is a global community with people from every continent. If you are interested in NaturistHub.com, please let me know so that I can send you an invite.

The new membership system, Impexium, is implemented and in final testing. Members that are not associated with clubs are already using it to manage their memberships. And very soon, club's certifying officers will also be allowed access to the new system. The new system has a modern interface and is very easy to use. Additionally, there is functionality that allows the AANR office and other AANR leaders to more easily use the information in the system to serve you, AANR's membership. Because we have added ability to communicate, our committees are grappling with how often we should communicate with you. We want to be able to reach out and remind you that you are important to AANR. For example, send you a birthday card. But would extra communications be onerous? How much communication is too much? Do we let each individual config it? These questions may seem trivial, but we really do want to serve our members and let them know they are valued.

We are developing ways to embrace diversity. This includes showing why embracing diversity is economically advantageous to all clubs. We are looking to develop training materials for clubs to help them learn how to embrace diversity.

There is a new social media handbook. Social media is a very important communication tool. This handbook has some guidelines on how to use social media. This is not so much a technical manual as much as a guidebook on how to positively represent AANR and nudism.

AANR is celebrating our 90th AANRversary this year. AANR-NW is also celebrating our 75th AANRversary this year. The AANRversary committee is looking at ways to make the celebration a memorable, fun way to turn 90 years old.

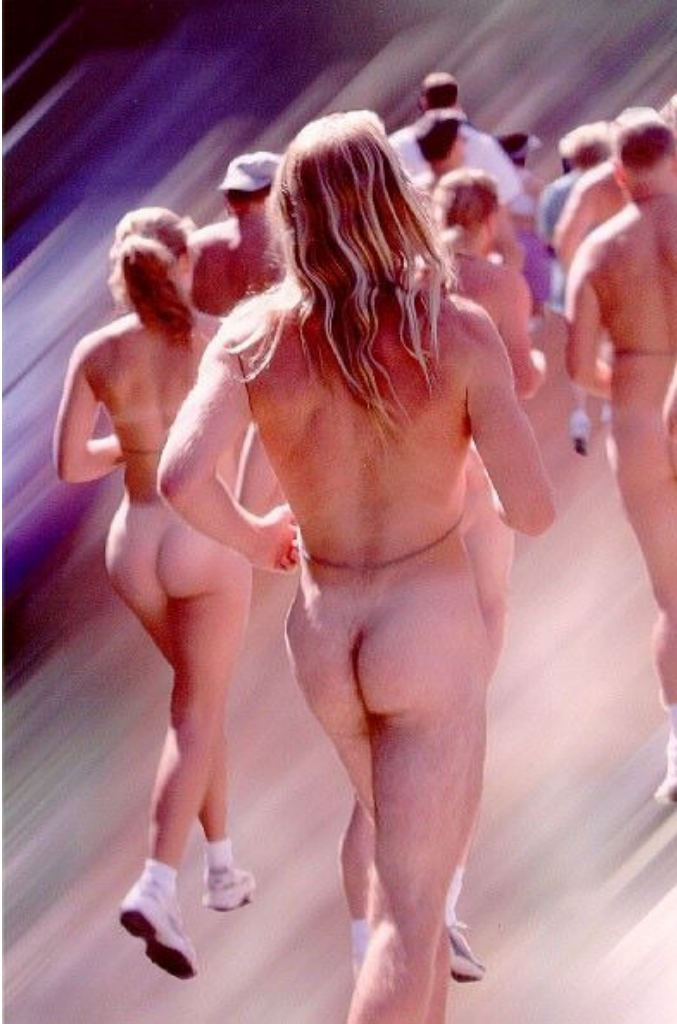

Digital Communications – AANR-NW – Spring Board Meeting 2021

- The e-news subscriber list is at 1218 valid recipients, down slightly from 1224 last spring. Our mailings have been more sporadic than usual, with little news or events to report and with our family difficulties that we were dealing with. One issue went out two weeks ago and one will go out this week, before the board meeting. We had been sending out a bi-weekly mailing with a list of the events at clubs around the region for the following four weeks, along with other news items. The items in the event list also include links to the club websites. In every issue, we had also been including an updated report on the current status of each club (whether they're open, what events are coming), as well as we can determine from their websites and other sources. The open rate (the per cent of mailings being opened by the recipients) is running about 25%, down a bit from pre-pandemic, but still a very high rate in general for bulk mailings. The click rate (the per cent of readers who click on at least one link and visit some web site as a result) is running at about 6%; this is down a bit since there are almost no events to explore with many clubs closed.
- We'll continue to add events to the calendar on aanr-nw.org as they get announced for the summer. Users can filter by club, by AANR-NW events, by major events and other categories.
- The cpanel that is included as part of our hosting package provides a mechanism for editing websites online.
- Eight club websites are being hosted by aanr-nw.org, as well as the aanr-w.org regional site. We handle the domain registration for all of them. We also handle domain registration and email for the Willamettans. We also provide a web site to the AANR Education Foundation. Please let us know if your club would like to take advantage of either free hosting or domain registration service. (dcc@aanr-nw.org)

- The DCC has provided individualized technical assistance to several of our member clubs.
- Last fall we were having a potential problem with the aanr-nw.org site where the number of files on the site was growing and approaching our limit for files, even though the storage space wasn't growing and was OK. If we had reached the limit, the main effect would have been not being able to receive e-mail for some of our accounts. I found that something was creating empty temporary files and never deleting them, possibly a failing WordPress plugin. I simply deleted the offending temp files, which dropped our usage down to about 23%. The problem seems to have stopped, so it may be that updates to WordPress or WordPress plugins solved it.

If you wonder what your Government Affairs team is doing, we have updated our legislative tracking system to a more comprehensive program called "**FiscalNote**" that reviews state and federal legislation. The program looks for words in legislation that could, potentially have an impact on nude recreation. There is a whole list of words, the most obvious being: "Nude, Nudity, Indecent exposure, penis, nipple," and many more. Then individuals across the country review these bills to determine if there is a direct or even indirect threat to nude recreation. Sometimes this comes as a result of "unintended consequences" such as the topless coffee stands ruling that had far reaching impact on nude gathering.

Going through such legislation is an arduous task, as the legalese writing is long-winded and often hard to follow, requiring search of prior legislation referred to. But there is more that every nudist can do.

If you hear or read of a proposal in your state or local government-legislature or city council, that concerns you, please don't ignore it. See if you can identify a specific city/state and even a title or bill number and let me know to look into it in depth. At some point it may be important for us to make contact with the bill writers or to attend public hearings, but this is uncommon.

The team of more than 30 individuals from AANR, the AANR Regions and TNS conference monthly, noting issues such as the closure of Little Beach in Hawaii or the need for letters/emails of support to legislators in Florida who are considering the importance of nude beaches to the Florida economy. This can be extremely helpful when a state passes Pro-Nudity legislation for a state's benefit. This kind of legislation provides support to present to lawmakers who are considering a law in our own states.

Stay alert! Remain vigilant. We are working together to protect Nude Recreation in America!



AANR-NW PUBLIC LANDS REPORT Spring Board 2021

Thanks to those who assisted at the 2020 Oregon nude beach clean-ups despite having to do it during the middle of the pandemic. The beach adoption paperwork with the Oregon State parks department and SOLVE is signed for this year. This will be the last year that I will be planning them. Lead volunteers for 2022 and beyond need to step forward.

As mentioned before, these clean-ups are a good way for us to let the public know about our community involvement. We are doing these in conjunction with SOLVE, as well as the Oregon State Parks and Fish and Wildlife departments. We need additional volunteers at these events so that we can retain our beach sponsorships. We do litter clean-up, invasive species eradication and trail widening. No parking fees are levied for our volunteers and we usually (except during covid events) have a hot dog roast at the conclusion of each event which sometimes includes voluntary food contributions from attendees. Look for potential event scheduling starting in June. [These legal nude beaches are unique to Oregon and we want to continue to keep our beaches bare!! We are hoping the clubs around Portland will consider to continue assisting with the adoption of these twice-yearly clean-ups. Contact me if you are interested in getting on our notification list.

AANR-NW HISTORIAN REPORT - 2021 SPRING BOARD MEETING

Fourth of July weekend, 1946 - the first conference (convention) of the Northwest Sunbathing Conference (now AANR-NW) was held at the Cobblestone club near Yelm, Washington. Art Hamilton was elected the first regional president. It is now seventy five years later and only a few northwest clubs that were started in the 1930's and 1940's are still in existence. More have been added since 1946 and, even now, new clubs are forming, while others have dropped from existence.

The regional Archive/Library has been mostly closed since the Covid19 virus made safe close contact almost impossible in small buildings. It is hoped to be able to reopen it at times this summer, however a failure of the power feeder line to the buildings is requiring a replacement/upgrade to be accomplished, which may cost much of our budgeted funds. Additional money will also be spent sending some historic 8mm films to be digitized plus some issues of the *Bulletin* were sent to us to complete the series from the mid 1960's to the present. Both will require postage costs and the films and videos will have mailing costs both ways. It is also possible that a replacement desk may be needed.

Almost the entire main building and the annex have been rearranged by LuCinda Gustavson (see photos below) and further cataloging of materials will be started soon. Thanks to her! The old Microsoft Works files were converted to a spreadsheet/database format last year. The Consortium of nudist libraries is up and running and a sharing of digital files may become possible at the northwest library if a reliable wifi system is installed or shared, as planned. A mutual cataloging format, entitled the Master Catalog Concept Plan, has been suggested to make all filing records easily shareable. The Consortium now has contacts with German, British and Dutch nudist libraries and representatives are on the quarterly Zoom meetings along with the four US based libraries.



As the region celebrates its 75th year in 2021 and AANR its 90th, the history of northwest nudism will continue to be treasured in our library!

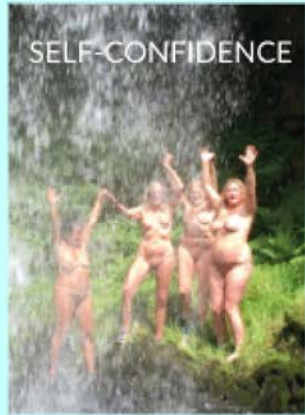

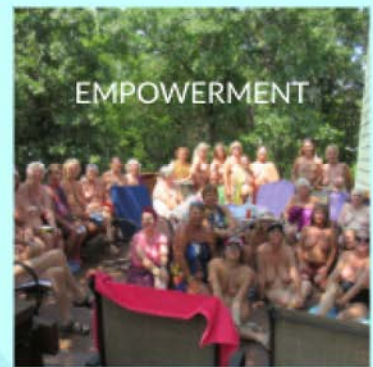

Background Check Committee Report for AANR NW Spring 2021 Board Meeting

- Committee members – Cynthia Knox, Mark Buchweitz, Andee Rodgers, and Don Romano

- Method/Survey – We asked the following questions to the 16 Clubs which comprise the AANR NW Region:

Q: Does your club do background checks?

A. Yes – 10, Occasionally – 2, No – 2, No info available – 2

Q: At what point does your club do a background check?

A. Feel funny about a guest – 1, At the gate, first visit – 1, At member application – 7, No info available – 3, Not applicable – 3, As needed – 1

Q: How many members do you have in your club during a “normal” year?

A. 50 – 350, with no info for 4 clubs, and 1 club has no members (B&B)

Q. How many new members per year during a “normal” year?

A. 6 -100, with 6 clubs no info available, and 1 with no members

Q. What is the scope of the check? National? Statewide? County?

A. 6 National Checks (with possible county as well), 1 Statewide, 1 County only, 6 no info available, Not applicable - 2

Q. What do you look for when conducting a background check?

A. 6 – sex crimes (and some said felonies as well), 3 – felonies, 5 – no info available, 2 not applicable

Q. What company or other source(s) do you use?

A. Sentrylink – 2, PublicData -1, Backgroundcheck.com – 1, Fortress.wa.gov – 1, Criminalcheck.com -1, Free County Records – 1, State Patrol – 1, No info available – 6, Not applicable – 1, Private relationship with law enforcement – 1

Q. Who in your club conducts the background checks? (What role do they play at your club)?

A. Membership Chair – 4, Office Staff – 1, President – 1, Hostess – 2, Certifying Officer – 2, Club Secretary – 1, Treasurer – 1, No title for person who does checks – 1, No info available – 3, Booking agent – 1

Q. How much does your club pay for a background check?

A. Free – 2, \$11 – 1, \$14 – 1, \$400 for up to 1200 checks annually - 1, \$15 -1 (pays \$1500 in advance then replenishes account when needed), \$19.95 – 1, \$42 – 1, No info available – 5, Not applicable – 2

Q. How much does the visitor/member applicant pay for a background check?

A. Not applicable – 3, No info available – 8, Free – 1, \$10 – 1, \$25 – 1, \$40 for two checks - 1, Yes, included in membership application fee – 1

Q. Are members re-checked at any point after initial background check?

A. Yes – 2, Maybe – 2, No – 4, No info available – 5, Not applicable – 3

Q. If re-checked, when is that done?

A. If needed/complaint filed – 2, After 1 year probation – 1, No info available – 10, No rechecks – 1, Not applicable - 2

This committee found it challenging to get to the person(s) who knew the answers to our questions due to each club being organized differently from each other and it often took multiple contacts with multiple people to fill in the blanks. Some clubs are seasonal only, so contact was more complicated.

Background Check Companies that we researched that provide national and county checks:

1. criminalcheck.com – free. National sex offender only lookups.
2. publicdata.com – owns criminalcheck.com. \$250 per year for up to 3000 national criminal lookups
3. www.nsopw.gov – free National Sex Offender Public Website for locations of sex offenders
4. SentryLink.com - \$19.95 for each lookup, or bulk plan (pre-paid) \$12 per lookup for up to 500 lookups per year. See attached sheet with details on the plans.
5. DataSource.com –\$12.95 each for bulk pricing for up to 1000 National crime and sex offender lookups. See attached sheet for details on levels of service available. Lake Como Family Nudist Resort uses this service.
6. <https://www.truthfinder.com/background-check> – pricing unclear. Gives much more personal info that is likely not helpful (relatives, debt, assets, etc.) and could be perceived as an invasion of privacy.
7. Backgroundchecks.com - \$29.95 for individual checks, no info yet on bulk pricing

Options for AANRNW Clubs to do/not do background checks:

1. Keep doing/not doing the same as before
2. Pick a new way/source of doing them and purchase checks through an individual account for each club
3. AANR NW sign up for a group account, and individual clubs would log-in to the background check company through an AANR NW portal. An AANR volunteer would need to do a monthly accounting of how many background checks each participating club uses and handle billing/collection.

Questions generated after conducting research:

1. Why do some clubs prioritize checking visitors and guests and others do not?
2. Do member clubs of AANRNW want to band together and establish standard background check requirements? We have a variety of protocols throughout the organization involving whether, when, and how they do the checks and how they interpret the results.
3. Do AANRNW member clubs wish to have a group account to reduce the cost of background checks?
4. If clubs wish to participate in a bulk pricing plan, how many (approximately) would each club like to plan on using on a monthly or annual basis?
5. Should this committee continue this research, and which direction (s) should we go in?
